

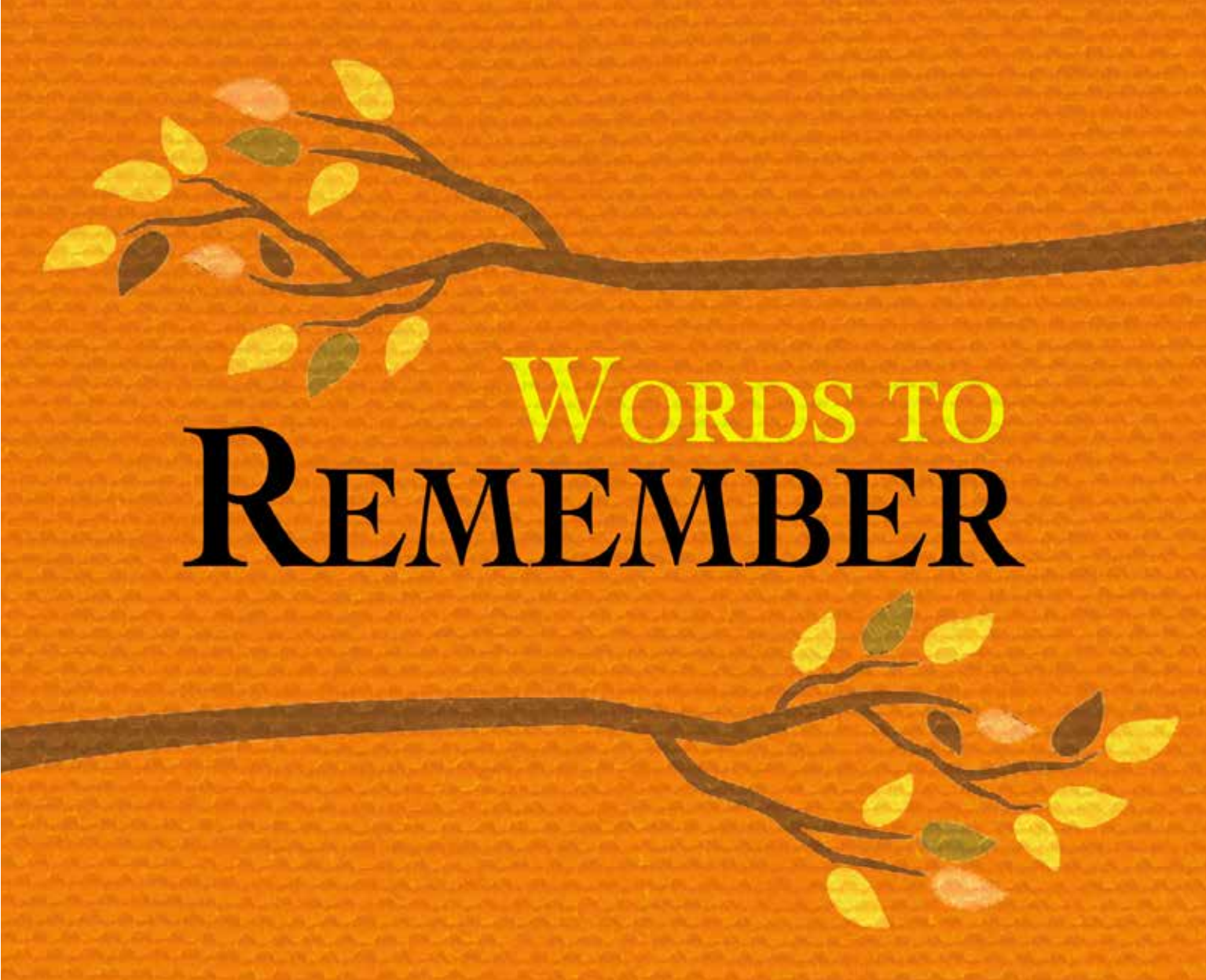

Words to Remember

“And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.” (1 John 5:11–13, NIV)

Have you ever had to memorize something? Think back to school. If your experience was like mine, you had to memorize the pledge of allegiance. When you were a kid in Sunday school, you may have had to memorize familiar verses like John 3:16 or “The Golden Rule” (Matthew 7:12). In English class, you may have had to memorize short poems. And if you’re like me, you’ve found it very important in life to remember important practical information like your social security number, your medical record number, and important anniversaries.

I came to faith in Christ when I was about 10 years old. But it wasn’t until several years later, when I was a freshman in high school, that I followed Christ in baptism and became a member of the local church where my family attended. One thing I appreciated about that church was the process they had for people like me: New believers wanting to grow in their faith. This process included providing new members with a little booklet called “Growing in Christ,” which included small scripture memorization cards to help new believers hide the word of God in their hearts. To this day, I’m still able to recall some of the verses that were featured on those cards, applying them to different types of ministry needs that have crossed my path. It’s like a spiritual toolkit that I can take with me anywhere I go.

There are many different spiritual disciplines: Prayer, worship, Bible reading, giving, serving, and so on. These are all important ways to practice your faith as a Christian and grow in your faith. However, during this fall and the upcoming Advent season, we will be focusing on another spiritual discipline: *Scripture memorization*. And we will be using the same little booklet that was so meaningful to me

about 30 years ago as a new believer. Why? Because I know that some of those attending FBC these days are still pretty new to their faith. Not only that, but I also know that the rest of us, including me, would really benefit from having God’s word tucked away into our minds and hearts, ready to be recalled at a moment’s notice, to address the different situations we face in daily life, and to encourage the people we encounter along the way.

As with any journey, this one must start somewhere. And, as it turns out, we begin our journey of scripture memorization with 1 John 5:11–13, a passage all about the *assurance of salvation*. What an important theological concept! Your view on this will shape the way you think about a lot of things and influence the way you live life. It will inform the level of confidence (or lack thereof) with which you will face all sorts of different situations. No wonder then, as we go about the business of *growing in Christ* as followers of Jesus, that this is the place where our journey begins.

So, join us this season as we add other important passages to our *memorization repertoire*. *Each Sunday at 10:30am we will be introducing the scripture of the week.* Then, everyone is welcome to join us for our sermon-based Bible study, called “Table Talk,” which takes place every Wednesday at 7:00 pm at church (enter through the 12th Ave. gate). And don’t forget to pick up your free copy of the booklet “Growing in Christ,” which you can feel free to work through on your own or in community at Table Talk.

David and Goliath

PART 1: A STORY OF FAITHFULNESS

So David arose early in the morning and left the flock with a keeper and took the supplies and went as Jesse had commanded him. (1 Samuel 17:20)

1. DAVID WAS FAITHFUL IN THE

SMALL THINGS. After the prophet Samuel anointed David to be the future king of Israel, David returned to his dad, Jesse, and worked as a shepherd. He tended the sheep while his three oldest brothers went to fight the Philistines, including the giant Goliath. One day Jesse asked David, who was about seventeen, to bring food to them. David left his sheep with another shepherd, took the supplies, and went as his dad had told him (1 Samuel 17:20). Jesus said, “He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful also in much” (Luke 16:10). These small acts of obedience prepared David for his moment with Goliath.

2. DAVID KNEW GOD WAS FAITHFUL. As David talked with his brothers, Goliath mocked the army of Israel. The men fled in fear, but David asked, “Who is this uncircumcised Philistine to taunt the armies of the living God?” (1 Samuel 17:26). That wasn’t a casual statement. It showed David’s deep awareness of God’s power and faithfulness.

3. DAVID WAS READY BECAUSE HE KNEW THE BATTLE WAS THE LORD’S. We may not see literal nine-foot giants anymore, but we face real opposition. “Goliaths” are anything that antagonizes the people of God and tries to disrupt God’s plan and purpose. When you get some time, read or listen to all of 1 Samuel 17, the story of David and Goliath. Whatever you are facing in your life right now, remember the battle belongs to the Lord (1 Samuel 17:47).

PART 2: CONFIDENCE THAT FLOWS FROM CONNECTION

The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, He will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine.” (1 Samuel 17:37a)

1. DAVID FOSTERED FAITH BY REMEMBERING WHAT GOD HAD DONE BEFORE. When King Saul heard David wanted to fight Goliath, he told David he couldn’t win. But David responded by remembering how God helped him kill a lion and a bear when they attacked his sheep – and how Goliath would be no different because he had taunted “the armies of the living God” (1 Samuel 17:33-36).

2. DAVID RELIED ON GOD, NOT METHODOLOGY. Saul offered David his armor, but David took it off. He later told Goliath, “You come to me with a sword, a spear, and a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts” (1 Samuel 17:45). Saul had his methods, Goliath had his, but only David trusted in God.

3. DAVID STAYED CONNECTED TO GOD. David was strong in the Lord because he fellowshiped with God (Psalm 27). The people of Israel had lost connection and were in retreat mode. But David lived what Jesus told us: “He who abides in Me... bears much fruit” (John 15:5). Our fellowship with God is the most important part of any battle.

Use your past breakthroughs to connect the points of God’s faithfulness in your life. The God who delivered you then will deliver you now.

SAY THIS OUT LOUD:

The Lord is my light and my salvation. The Lord is the defense of my life. My heart will not fear. I will be confident. (Psalm 27:1-3) The same God who delivered me before will deliver me again (1 Samuel 17:37).

What is the “Heart of Worship?”

We sing a song called “Heart of Worship” and some of the lyrics include:

*“I’m coming back to the **heart of worship**,
and it’s all about You, it’s all about You, Jesus”
“Though I’m weak and poor, all I have is Yours,
every single breath”.*

The word “heart” occurs more than one thousand times in the Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments. It denotes a person’s center of being, for both physical and emotional activity.

We understand “worship” to mean ALL that encompasses the recognition, belief, and obedience to the holy and righteous God.

Therefore the “Heart of Worship” can be understood to mean: **All that I do physically, and all that I express emotionally, should be done to bring God the glory He deserves.** (“And whatever you do in word or deed, do ALL in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.” —*Colossians 3:17*)

We learn that God alone can see what is in the “heart” of a person.

In 1 Samuel 16, we learn the history of how God ultimately selected David to replace the evil king Saul. In verse 7 we read, “But the Lord said to Samuel (a priest at that time), ‘Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him (one of the sons of Jesse). For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.’”

Hebrews 4:12 reaffirms this truth. “For the Word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; and it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.”

God is very well aware that our hearts are deceitful and wicked (Jeremiah 16:9). We all suffer with a sinful nature as we live out our physical days on this earth. However, the truth of scripture can be a transforming tool.

Romans 12:2 encourages us to “not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind (through scripture). Then you will be able to test and approve what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God.”

Psalms 45 offers an excellent example of mind and heart renewal. The writer begins with these words in verse 1 and following: “My heart is stirred by a noble theme as I recite my verses for the king; my tongue is the pen of a skilled writer.” He goes on to describe and worship our wonderful Lord, ending with this: “I will perpetuate Your memory through all generations; therefore the nations will praise You for ever and ever.”

David Mathis, Editor of *Desiring God* and Pastor at Cities Church, writes this concise conclusion regarding our hearts in worship. “The **heart of worship** is not *music* and *song*, but *heads* and *hearts* in joyful awe of the real Jesus”.

As you and I continue to renew our hearts and minds through our prayers and reading of God’s Word, we can also be mindful to come to church prepared to worship collectively with our family members. We can purposefully be participants, not just consumers.

We can, as the song says, “come back to the Heart of Worship”.

Meet the new Pastoral Assistant

My name is Raphi, and I'm excited to introduce myself as the newest addition to the staff. I've been serving as Pastor Matt's assistant and as a worship intern under Pastor Trudi. It has been a joy to work with FBC and to get to know so many of you better. My role includes things like answering phone calls and emails, organizing office spaces, helping log expenses, assisting with worship services, and studying what it means to worship alongside Trudi and Nik.

A little of my story:

I was born in India and raised in Nepal until I was 7, where my grandparents run a children's home called Mendies Haven. My family then moved back to the States, and I grew up homeschooled with my four siblings. When I was 12, my parents divorced, and I entered a season of isolation where I felt numb to emotion. One summer at camp, after hearing a testimony similar to my own, I prayed for the Lord's healing—and for the first time in a long time, I was able to cry again.

Before that moment, I had always believed in God and desired His presence. But this was the first time I turned to Him in deep desperation instead of looking elsewhere. If there's been one theme in my story, it's identity.

I've often asked myself: "Who am I?" Too many times, I've let other things define me—what people think of me, my family's stability, the presence of loved ones, worldly pleasures, or accomplishments. Again and again, those things failed me: people talked behind my back, my family broke apart, loved ones passed away, pleasures left me empty, and I fell short of my own expectations. But every time I turned to God, He met me, answered me, and rescued me.

For years, the tension between what God thought of me and what people thought of me even kept me from being baptized. On every baptism Sunday I felt the Lord's call, but I worried people would think I hadn't truly been walking with Him before. That fear of others' opinions got in the way of obedience. But God was patient with me. When I was 18, I finally took the step of baptism, and since then He has continued to draw me closer, making me bolder in my faith and more reliant on Him with each new season.

I'm grateful to be here at FBC and to walk alongside you all as we pursue Jesus together.

Facilities and Building Report

This year has been a very busy year so far. Many ups and downs along the way, but nothing God has not handled for us. We have many projects that have been going on and working on getting going, and some that have been put on hold. Everything from an LED project to help cut back on electricity bills, all the way to a gate project.

LED Project: The LED project is all mapped out. There is officially a map (technically, a list.) that will be in my office. Luckily, some random bulbs have already been switched out. The bulbs that primarily need to be switched out are the fluorescent bulbs that are around the building. There are a total of 380–400 fluorescent bulbs alone.

The Gate Project: As a few of you know, we have a Gate Project that was in full swing, then some issues came up with the city. The locations of the Gates are the entrances on 12th and the Taylor street doors. The Gates that we want to install are swing gates, but due to an encroachment law and other things to try and work around, the City has told us that the gates we have gotten approved through the EC are “non-negotiable and can not be installed” due to “Safety factors”. With that being said, we are pushing forward to still get some sort of gate installed outside those doors in the next few months to protect the integrity of those doors and the building.

Pew Cushion Revival: Another project we have in the works is what we have dubbed the “Pew Cushion Revival”. Many of our Cushions have been around not just for years, but for generations. They have stains from over the years. We have run an experiment to clean them and will be cleaning and “Reviving” these cushions a little bit and working on taking these stains out. This is going to be a week long job at least.

As you can see we are staying busy to keep up with everything that goes on in this beautiful 130 year old Church Building. Rick and I always have our hands full with one thing or another, but this building is so big, to

do some projects we would have to drop the other work completely. We here at First Baptist Church of Portland are always looking for volunteers. People who may come in and do small projects like vacuuming, or maybe helping install LED's or helping with the cushions. There is more than one way of giving to a church; Time is one of them. If you are curious or want to give some time talk to myself or Pastor Sam, we will help you get going in the right direction! God has blessed us this year, and his blessing will continue in 2026!

Mercy and Grace

Lately I have been hearing a phrase I have not heard for some time. It is the simple phrase of “Mercy and Grace”. This is a phrase that many of us have heard when we are “losing our cool” or are “frustrated and hurt” about how others have acted towards us.

We have “all sinned, and fallen short of the glory of God.” (Romans 3:23) As human beings, we may not understand why someone has hurt us in one way or another. There are times we act before we think, or we have the urge to do so. Romans 3:24 goes on to talk about the greatest and most perfect grace that we could receive as we are “justified freely by HIS Grace through the redemption that came by Jesus Christ.”

God showed us the ultimate “Mercy and Grace,” in the midst of our not-so-always-perfect way of thinking. Instead of making it to where we would all end up on the other side of the chasm, He sent His son, Jesus, to die on the cross and eliminate the sins that we have done. Through Jesus, and his death on the cross, grace allows us to get us to the other side of the chasm. Mercy is no longer being separated from God as we should be, but instead we get to learn and grow in a relationship with him.

So next time someone has wronged you, think about the Ultimate time that we were forgiven and shown “Grace and Mercy”. And ask God for the strength you need to show it to someone who doesn't deserve it in our eyes. Here are some verses that we can read and pray about when we need to show Mercy and Grace:

Romans 12:17-18 ; Ephesians 4:29 ; James 1:9.

Pastoral Ministry Intern Report

It has been a grace to share a small part in the momentum that is building in the KidChurch program at Portland FBC.

Earlier this summer I did some investigation into Sunday morning curriculum for the 25/26 year. I had delightful conversations with AWANA national and our local Children's Evangelism Fellowship Portland office. I was able to gain insight into the overall fit of these offerings and share that with the KidChurch team, including Lisa Toupin, the Children's Ministry Coordinator. With this information, the best decision could be made for the upcoming year.

It has been a true blessing to share Bible stories with the children. This summer I selected memory verses and Sunday school lessons. The memory verses were Luke 19:10 and John 14:6. Luke 19:10 teaches children that Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. With that scripture, I accompanied stories like the Parable of the Lost Sheep and Zaccheus. The intent is to have children understand that Jesus is longing to gift His salvation freely to anyone who believes in Him.

There is only one way to come into a relationship with God and that is through His Son, Jesus – this is the emphasis of the second memory verse (John 14:6). With this verse I accompanied stories like Naaman and Cain and Abel, to help children understand that there is only one way to restore harmony with God. Secondly, I was also able to emphasize that God has called children to live lives of obedience.

Finally, a great highlight from this summer was sharing the gospel. Many of the kids have heard this message before, and this is good news! Their loving mothers and fathers, Pastors and this congregation have together been faithful to plant His Word in their hearts. As we moved through the rhythm of the account — the heart of God which is love, the problem of sin, the cleansing blood of Jesus, and the resurrection to new life — I could see their faces respond in comprehension and responsibility. I pray for their continued growth in understanding what God has done for each of them.

Cambodian Children's Ministry (CCM)

Our annual fundraiser on September 21, 2025, was another success! By God's grace, we raised \$9,635, surpassing our goal of \$4,000! About 95 people participated with enthusiasm, prayer, and generous giving. Special thanks to our auctioneer! We extend our heartfelt thanks to the fundraiser team, cooks, kitchen staff, pastoral staff, and supporters who made this possible.

During the event, we also commissioned our November 2025 mission trip team. Currently, 13 members are preparing to go, each contributing their travel expenses and raising funds to support the children's center. Please pray for this team as they serve in Cambodia as part of the Great Commission.

We are also grateful for the BottleDrop Project, which has raised \$1,500 to date. Thank you to everyone who has faithfully supported this effort.

Several exciting projects have been completed at the children's center, including the fish pond, a new fence, and the remodeling of two gazebos, all generously sponsored by individual supporters. Language and computer classes continue to grow, supported by monthly scholarships from our partners and sponsors. We also meet weekly with the children and staff via Zoom, and our youth group recently attended a seminar in Kampong Chhnang Province.

Bible studies and student ministries remain active, thanks to the faithful work of our facility manager and staff. Transportation to and from programs—including

Sunday services—continues smoothly, though our tuk-tuk often needs repairs!

Looking Ahead

We look forward to updating you next quarter with God's blessings from the upcoming mission trip. Please continue to pray for Shirley and me—for health, strength, and financial support—as we serve the Lord and carry forward the ministry here and in Cambodia. 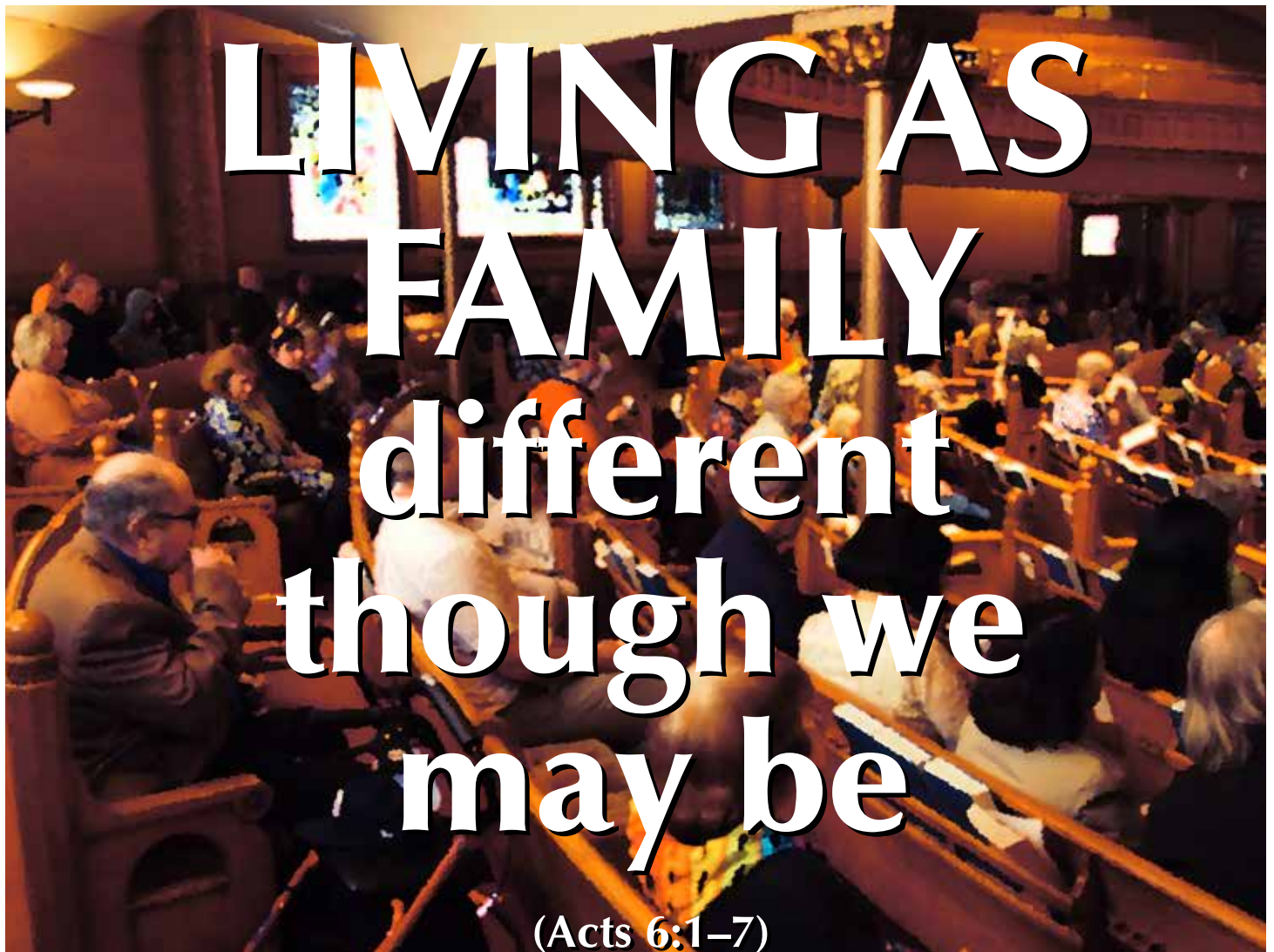
New Church Directory Available Soon!
