



At nearly 50 miles, the Greater Cheyenne Greenway is the largest hard-surface multi-use path system operated by a single municipality in the northern Front Range. The first segment of Greenway was approved by voters and constructed in the early 1990s. The Greenway connects to neighborhoods, schools, parks and businesses. According to 15 trail counters spread throughout the system, hundreds of residents use the Greenway each day for walking, running and even bird watching. The below propositions will help maintain, repair, improve and expand the Greenway throughout Cheyenne.

6TH PENNY BALLOT GREENWAY PROJECTS



LARAMIE COUNTY PROPOSITION 1

Greenway upgrades, maintenance and drainage improvements along the Allison Draw corridor that runs under Avenue C, S. Greeley Highway, W. Prosser Road and College Drive in South Cheyenne. \$1 million



CITY OF CHEYENNE PROPOSITION 2

Repairs, upgrades and maintenance of the City's existing 50 miles of Greenway system. \$3 million



CITY OF CHEYENNE PROPOSITION 14

New Greenway construction and major rehabilitation projects. Examples include trail extension from York Avenue to Cribbon Avenue, trail extension from Ames Avenue to the Historic Downtown Depot, the Yellowstone Road underpass rehabilitation, the North College Drive underpass rehabilitation and the Sun Valley to Kiwanis Community Park trail extension. \$3 million
