



Miniseries have been a staple of TV entertainment since "Poor Man Rich Man" first aired in 1976. This type of programming completes a story arc in a limited time, usually four to eight episodes. Miniseries are attractive because viewers do not have to wait for the next season to be released to wrap up a storyline. This week in worship, we are embarking on our own miniseries amid our larger series of the Bible Year. Over the next four weeks, we will concentrate on a deeper dive into the Book of Isaiah. Yes, please continue apace with the scheduled reading, which you can find here. As you continue to read through the wisdom literature of Ecclesiastes and the Song of Solomon on your own, in worship, the focus will be on taking us through Isaiah.

Isaiah is a crucial book that helps us understand God's judgment on Israel in general and Jerusalem in particular for ignoring God's teaching in the books of Moses. Their worship had become a dead ritual, and they ignored God's commands to seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, and plead for the widow Isaiah 1:11-17. Furthermore, they sought to ensure their future by making a military alliance with Egypt, "Oh rebellious children, says the Lord, who carry out a plan, but not mine; who make an alliance, but against my will, adding sin to sin; who set out to go down to Egypt without asking for my counsel, to take refuge int he protection of Pharaoh, and to seek shelter in the shadow of Egypt; therefore the protection of Pharaoh shall become your shame, and the shelter of Egypt your humiliation" (Isaiah 30:1-3 NRSV).

God is not happy, to say the least, and there will be severe consequences for forgetting the Lord's way. Yet, in the midst of this judgment, there is also grace and hope. God does not judge to exact retribution but to re-establish the God/creature relationship to its proper place. I hope this miniseries will allow us to see how vital understanding God's nature, as presented in our previous reading of the Bible, is in making good decisions. Additionally, we will see a new hope emerge whereby God lays the groundwork for the eventual embodiment of God's self in the person of Jesus Christ.

The schedule of selected texts is:

June 29 - <u>Isaiah 6:1-13</u> July 6 - <u>Isaiah 9:2-9</u> July 13 - <u>Isaiah 40</u> July 20 - <u>Isaiah 53</u>

We will have a formal celebration and blessing later in the summer. The Church Council has already begun the search for Ben's successor, so please pray for that work and for the person God is calling to be in ministry to our students and their families. Be in prayer for Ben and his family as they expand the Kingdom of God through this church plant.

Sisterhood Getaway - September 12-14!












NTS Camp
