




This week, Nehemiah 2:1-10 is our principal text as we continue our journey through the Bible. Following the utter desolation of their homeland, the leading citizens of Israel were forced into exile in Babylon. The Babylonian Empire will eventually fall to the Persian Empire. When this happens, the Persian ruler permits Jews to return home. Nehemiah is one of the leaders who goes back and begins the arduous task of rebuilding. Long gone are the days of King David's military might and the magnificence of Solomon's worldrenowned wisdom. The Temple, which Solomon built, is a pile of rubble, and Jerusalem's walls are no more. The human remnant that remained was demoralized and on the cusp of becoming a footnote in world history. Nehemiah is called to go and rebuild the walls and help the people regain their footing. Neither is an easy task. Yet we must not forget that God has a different calculus than we do. Any investor with an ounce of sense would have written Israel off as a bad investment and moved on to more promising opportunities. But we are not speaking of what is prudent and possible from a human perspective for the God of Israel does not balance ledgers the way humans do. This God spoke creation into being with words and called humans forth from the dust. God does much with little, and Nehemiah's story reminds us that God is the one shaping human history, not the bottom line in a financial report. God has not given up on His project to have a people represent Him back to the world. God is still working out the plan to be present in creation through the eventual advent of Jesus. A broken-down temple and crumbling walls will not stop God. As we prepare for Sunday, take some time to consider the resources God has given us. If God can revive a failed state on the verge of extinction, what can God do with what we have?






NTS Camp


