THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 26, 2025 A Note from Fr. Michael Praised be Jesus Christ! Dear Parish Family, This Sunday we find ourselves just a few days away from the beginning of November, a month, as you know, filled with several extremely significant dates in the Liturgical Calendar. Next Saturday is November 1st, the Solemnity of All Saints, normally it is a Holy Day of Obligation. Since the holy day falls this year on a Saturday, the obligation to attend Holy Mass is lifted. However, it still remains a Solemnity, that means a Feast Day of the highest rank. Even though Holy Mass is not obligatory this year, please consider coming to Holy Mass to honor the saints who have gone before us and to seek their intercession. Holy Mass will be offered at 9:00 The following day, Sunday, November 2nd, is All Souls Day, a day dedicated to praying and offering Mass for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Beginning on Saturday, November 1st, until the following Saturday, November 8th, each day the Church grants a plenary indulgence for visiting a cemetery and offering prayers for the faithfully departed. This indulgence is applicable to a soul in purgatory. Just think, each day over the course of these eight days you can bring a Holy Soul into their heavenly homeland. On Saturday, November 8th at 12:00pm (noon) we will have a procession along with prayers for the Holy Souls at Mt. Calvary Cemetery. The procession will be in the cemetery on the paved road. Saint Martin de Porres Patron saint of social justice, racial harmony, and mixed-race people. Gave his heart and his goods to the poor and despised.



Saint Josephat Known for his religious reforms: purging idolatry, appointing judges, & sending out priests & Levits to teach the law to his people.




Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini Patron saint of immigrants and honored for her work in the U.S. establishing charitable institutions (schools, orphanages and hospitals) to help Italian immigrants. She is was the first United States citizen to be canonized.



Pope Leo the Great, Doctor of the Church, was a 5th-century pope known for his theological writings, administrative skills and efforts to establish papal authority. He was famous for reaffirming the Church's authority.

Saint Serapion was honored for his martyrdom, having sacrificed his own life in exchange for the freedom of 87 Christian captives in Algiers in 1240. Because of his cruel martyrdom on the cross, he is patron saint of those who suffer bone and joint pains.
