Can you imagine an Israelite leaving Bethlehem to go to Moab? Elimelech who was an Ephrathite (descendants of Ephraim who was Joseph’s son) took his whole family to Moab. Moab was located east of the Dead Sea and originated from the sin of Lot and his daughter. Joseph was forced to leave his family and was sold into slavery, but **Elimelech CHOSE to leave**. He did not wait on God to provide food and went outside of God’s will to see if he could find something better. His influence did not stop with him but affected his wife Naomi and her two sons. When Elimelech died, **Naomi still stayed in Moab**. It was not until her sons died that she decided to go back to God. When all was lost, she decided to go home. You can see how Naomi changed being in Moab so long. She told her daughters-in-law to return to their homes, but Ruth was persistent in going with Naomi. She said in Ruth 1:15, “And she said, Behold thy sister-in-law is gone back unto her people, and unto her gods, return thou after thy sister-in-law.” This verse is very sad as you have a mother-in-law who does not try to encourage both of her daughters-in-law to go with her back to God. She even lets one go back to her homeland to serve her gods. When you are backslidden, you never see anyone else. You are not concerned with your own family’s spiritual welfare. Hurricane Helene

The damage and lives lost in the storm that was 7-10 hours away from the ocean is still shocking. Helene cost 108 lives in North Carolina, 50 in South Carolina, 37 in Georgia, 34 in Florida, and 19 in Tennessee. The cost is now 59.6 billion dollars in North Carolina, 13.9 billion dollars in Florida, 6.46 billion dollars in Georgia, 1.48 billion dollars in South Carolina, and 1.35 billion dollars in Tennessee. I-40 through the North Carolina mountains is still hardly passable with one-lane traffic each way for nearly 50 miles. It destroyed 126,000 homes, 6,000 miles of roads were damaged, and there were 1,400 landslides. It is unbelievable. It was solely an act by God.
