Back in the late 1800s, Charles Spurgeon was giving a group of young ministers a tour of the church he pastored. The men asked him what the secret of his ministry was. Spurgeon showed them around the grand sanctuary that held a little over 6,000 people [the largest sanctuary in the world at that time], his study, etc., then took them to the basement to a large empty room. He said, "Brethren, this is the engine room. This is the room that is most responsible for the fruitfulness of the ministry here." The men looked confused because there was nothing in that room. Spurgeon then told them that over 500 men would gather in this room to pray for him every service as he preached. He stated, "The prayer-meeting must be maintained at all cost. If you visit a factory, you will find it's the engine room that keeps it running! If you stop that engine, every wheel will stand still." He went on to say, "It is only prayer meetings we are having? Just so. It is only the engine, but that is everything."

May the Lord burn it deep in our hearts to realize that without prayer EVERYTHING will come to a screeching halt! We want to encourage you (as our Lord did) to pray! We want to encourage you to join us in the prayer meetings on Sunday evening at 5:30 for our men and ladies, every day at noon, every Wednesday at 7:15, every Friday night at 9:00, and every Saturday evening at 6:00. Prayer is not easy work, but it is necessary work. It is also JOYFUL work! May our hearts cry out as the disciples, "Lord, teach us to pray!"
