

The First Sunday of Advent: The Candle of Creation By The family of Greg and Sarah

In the beginning, God created the Heavens and the Earth. Now the Earth was formless void, there was darkness over the deep, and God's Spirit hovered over the water.

"God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. God saw that light was good, and God divided light from darkness. God called light 'day' and darkness God called 'night.' Evening came and morning came: the first day."

Today we light the candle of Creation. God's first act, on the first day of Creation, was to separate the light from the darkness: the sun for daytime and seeing, for warmth, for colour, for energy, and joyful living; the dark for rest, for quiet, for dreams and renewal.

We light this candle to remind us that God is present in both the darkness and the light.



First Reading

Romans 13:11-14

And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armour of light. Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

"But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in Heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left.

"Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Church. We give thanks for inspiration.

Commissioning "Go Now in Peace"


Go now in peace. Never be afraid. God will go with you each hour of every day.
