

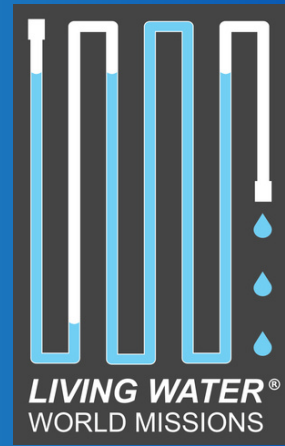

The Guatemalan team will largely remain the same as last year, except for the addition of Gaddy, who will provide part-time technical assistance in the Peten region. She is currently training under Josue to handle maintenance and repair work. Our hope that with the addition of a technician in this area, we can streamline our efforts, as servicing the systems there typically requires significant travel and expense.

This year, I aim to strengthen our communication with pastors; by reaching out individually to ensure that every aspect of our work is cared for with attention. Additionally, I am eager to establish a training program for our water system operators. These systems not only provide essential services but also develop connections with the hearts and lives of the people in Guatemala. I sincerely hope we can continue to nurture this vital relationship and work together to fulfill our mission with love and dedication.

2025 Installations of water systems in Guatemala:



A total of 7 systems were installed in Guatemala during 2025. They were installed in:

- Iglesia del Nazareno, Chisec, Alta Verapaz.
- Iglesia CA Alfa y Omega Chuk Muk II, Santiago Atitlán, Sololá.
- Hope of Life International, Río Hondo, Zacapa.
- IDEC Colonia Tikal, Esquipulas, Chiquimula.
- Hands of Jesus, Chichicastenango, Quiché.
- IDEC Garifuna, Livingston, Izabal
- And a re-installation at: Iglesia CA “Luz y Verdad” San José, San Francisco Zapotitlán, Suchitpéquez.

Education and Evangelism during the year:



The lesson plan for our Education Program was developed throughout six installations and one re-installation, with the participation of 1,831 children

Our Evangelism Program shared the message of salvation with 582 children, 16 teenagers, 71 elders, and 247 women across the communities we served.

A total of 51 homes were visited, addressing the needs of families and sharing the message of salvation.

Through the Education and Evangelism Programs, 2,124 people were reached and demonstrated receptiveness to the message of salvation.



Trainings by Regions and Operator's Trainings:

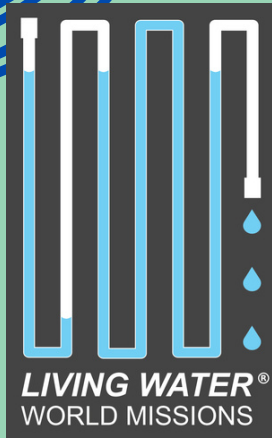
Seven regional training sessions were carried out, ensuring coverage of all involved areas throughout Guatemala. A total of 161 participants attended these trainings, which included workshops focused on Education and Evangelism, Financial training, and Operator training, strengthening both programmatic and technical capacities across the regions.

The trainings were conducted in the following regions: San Marcos, Huehuetenango, the Oriente region, Petén, Cobán, the Central region, and the Sur and Totonicapán area. A total of 208 participants attended these trainings, reflecting broad regional representation and strong engagement across the different locations.

A total of 172 individuals were trained through different capacity-building activities. This included 72 people trained during field visits, 65 individuals who participated in regional technical training sessions, and 35 people trained during the installation of new systems. These efforts strengthened technical knowledge and practical skills across various communities and regions.



Teams and Fundraisers:



In addition to the Board members, 49 team members participated in 2025. These team members came from California, Alaska, North Carolina, Iowa, Kentucky, Tennessee, and Florida, reflecting broad representation from across the United States.

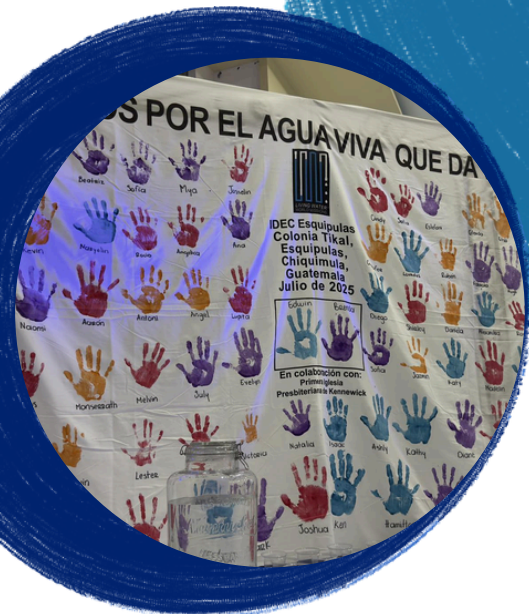

What a privilege it is to serve and witness lives transformed by saving grace!

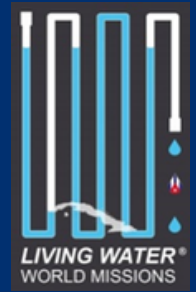

2025 SUMMARY – 2026 OUTLOOK:



CUBA, 2025

A frightened, broken nation on the verge of collapse.

The year 2025 unfolded on the island monotonously, wrapped in the same hardships of previous years. I reviewed the summaries I sent to Living Water at the end of 2023 and 2024 and chose not to repeat the same points—except to say that now the problems have intensified.

However, toward the end of the year, the monotony suddenly came to an end. The Caribbean Sea became filled with tension which, although it did not initially appear to be directed at us, directly involves us. The tension continued to grow and grow, and finally erupted just as the new year began.

The year 2025 in Cuba was marked by the following events:

- Productive paralysis and a disproportionate increase in the cost of living
- A statement by the now former Minister of Labor claiming: “There are no beggars in Cuba; they are people in disguise”
- The sentencing of the former Minister of Economy to life imprisonment
- University student protests against a sharp increase in telephone service rates
- A syndemic—simultaneous outbreaks of multiple viral illnesses, especially chikungunya, noted for its exponential spread, pain, inflammation, and long-term effects
- Power outages upon power outages becoming the new normal for a resigned and exhausted population, now living in anxious uncertainty
- Hurricane Melissa, which caused significant damage in our province and throughout eastern Cuba; mercifully, it entered the country as a Category 3 storm rather than the catastrophic Category 4 or 5 winds that had been predicted
- Thanks be to God, the year also brought “seismic calm” in our region, which has been under seismic alert since 2012

CUBA, 2026 OUTLOOK

Given the deterioration of the national electrical infrastructure, one does not need to be a prophet or a pessimist to predict that 2026 will be Cuba’s darkest year, as several experts have already warned. When this is combined with events in December in the Caribbean Sea involving vessels transporting crude oil to Cuba from Venezuela, the prediction is further reinforced. If we then add what occurred on January 3 in Caracas, with all its implications, the outlook worsens significantly—since this will not only affect electricity generation, but will result in a full energy collapse due to a total fuel shortage that could paralyze the country.

Events continue to unfold rapidly—wars and rumors of wars, mobilizations, and constant breaking news. What will happen? God has the final word. We are in His hands, and to Him be all the glory. While people prophesy darkness for 2026, God can turn it into the brightest year in our history. May His will be done.

CUBA, THE CHURCH

As an old hymn says: “In struggle and in trial, the Church keeps moving forward.”

We are not exempt from the hardships affecting our society, nor from the potential events that threaten it, but the Church is founded on Christ—and He said He would be with us always, even to the end of the world. Therefore: peace! The Cuban Church lives and grows. The sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that will be revealed in us. Hallelujah!

CUBA, LIVING WATER

In January 2025, a new purification system was installed at the 10th Baptist Church in Santiago de Cuba—a socially complex neighborhood, yet deeply in need of both clean water and Living Water.

Evangelistic activities continued throughout the year, primarily focused on women and children, and were very effective, with many lives accepting Jesus as Lord of their lives.

Operator training was held in April, and in December the Second Annual Conference took place, with the joy of once again welcoming part of the international team. They visited during Christmas and brought candy gift bags for the children of the various churches that are part of the Living Water ministry on the island.

Amid all this joy, we deeply felt the absence of a great man, brother, and friend. Only a process like the one he has gone through could have taken him away from here. He has done what was possible (treatment), we have done our part (fervent prayer for him), and I trust that God has already done His: the impossible—divine healing.

The year concluded with plans to implement the following as soon as possible in 2026:

- Installation of solar-based backup electrical systems for the water purification units—initially in El Dátil and the 10th Baptist Church in Santiago de Cuba, with plans to later do the same in El Cristo and Dos Caminos
- Upgrading existing older systems to the latest technology (ozone and ultraviolet light)

IN SUMMARY

2025 was another very difficult year for the nation, but a good year for the Cuban Church and for Living Water Cuba. The Lord of Hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. May His name be glorified!

On behalf of the Living Water Cuba team, I thank God for the faithfulness of each of our brothers and friends at Living Water World Missions. We are eternally grateful. May the Lord bless and prosper you. We love you.
