7th Annual Operator's Conference

Our system partners and staff have persevered through the pandemic to continue bringing clean water to those in need, in the name of Jesus Christ. It was abundantly clear to LWWM Guatemala staff that our system partners were in need of a conference to provide training, support, and fellowship in the midst of a difficult time due to COVID-19. So the staff prayed for God's guidance, worked out a plan to conduct a conference safely, and selected a theme "Blessed" (Dichoso in Spanish) based on Psalm 41.

Our system partners have continued to produce clean water for their communities in the midst of the pandemic. Some are temporarily closed because they are at schools that are in remote operations. But many have ramped up water production and have also supplied groceries to needy families. In December, our system partners at the El Shaddai church in Panajachel witnessed to members of the police department and widows of police officers who died in the line of duty. They shared the Gospel and donated food and clean water to many in need.

Cuba has recently seen surges in COVID-19 cases and many of our system partners are experiencing city-wide quarantines, including in Santiago de Cuba where most LWWM systems are located. Resources are often scarce in Cuba and the pandemic has intensified the struggles of many families to get basic necessities. Churches and water systems are closed. Limited

internet access makes online services challenging. Let us continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in Cuba. Our brother, Pastor Daniel reflects "By the grace of God we are here and God will make a way."

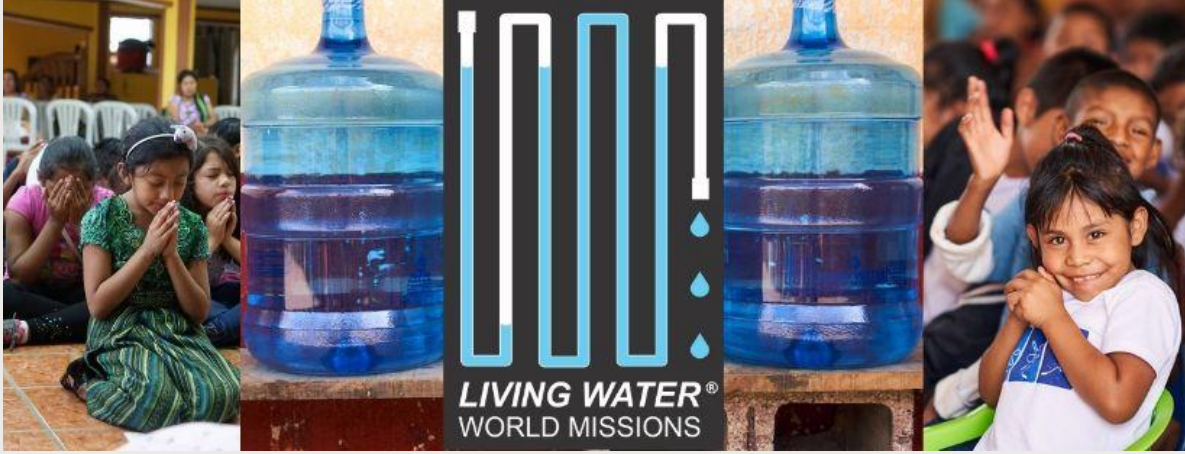
