DOGS

All dogs must be licensed through DocuPet: syracuse.docupet.com. Dog control can be reached by calling 315-442-5346.



NOISE

Noise that crosses property lines and disturbing others is prohibited by the city ordinance, with violations subject to fines may result in fines or imprisonment. Report violations to the police non-emergency line at 315-442-5111.



PARKING

To report parking violations, visit call 315-479-5300. Learn more about the City's parking rules at syr.gov/parking



ABANDONED VEHICLES

Unregistered or inoperable vehicles must be stored in a permanent structure; report violations at 315-442-5111.

Dear Neighbor,

I am proud to share the 2026 City Services Guide, prepared by our Department of Public Works (DPW) to serve as a year-round resource for Syracuse residents. This guide brings together important service schedules, guidelines, and contact information to help you access the City services you rely on every day.

I encourage you to keep this guide handy as a reminder of rules for trash and recycling disposal, sidewalk clearing and maintenance, sewer services, and yard waste management. Inside, you will find a citywide quadrant map, details on yard waste and construction debris collection, leaf pickup information, and the full 2026 biweekly recycling pickup schedule.

Winter in Syracuse requires preparation, coordination, and community effort. The guide includes information on winter services such as snow removal, parking rules and sidewalk responsibilities for property owners to ensure safe access for all. It also offers tips for winterizing your home and staying informed. To help residents track snow removal in real time, the City provides an online snowplow tracking map that shows where plows have been and long ago the location was plowed. I encourage all residents to review this information and use the City's winter resources to keep Syracuse safe, accessible, and moving all season long.

I also want to highlight SYRCityline for non-emergency service requests. The SYRCityline app allows residents to submit requests to City departments, track progress, and share feedback. You can also use place service requests online at syr.gov/cityline, or by calling the Cityline office at 315-448-CITY (2489). I encourage you to follow @SYRCityline on social media for updates and information.

Thank you for being active, engaged members of our community. Together, we can continue building a Syracuse that is clean, safe, and well cared for—block by block.

HOW TO DISCARD

TRASH *For residences with city-issued trash carts*

- Trash is collected weekly.
- Place bagged waste in your trash carts. Loose trash will not be collected.
- Securely close the cart lid to prevent litter and scavenging.
- Place your cart at the end of the driveway or in front of your house between the sidewalk and the street on your regular collection day.



Do not include TV's or electronics in your trash.
To dispose of these items, go to ocrra.org/ewaste



RECYCLING *For residences with city-issued recycling carts*

- Recycling is collected bi-weekly.
- Place recyclables in the cart loose. Bagged materials are not accepted.
- On your designated recycling week, place your cart at the end of your driveway or between your sidewalk and the street.

- Securely close the cart lid to prevent litter and scavenging.

ADOPT-A-BLOCK

BULK ITEMS *Includes furniture, carpets, mattresses, excess bags of trash, etc.*

You must schedule a bulk pickup at least two days in advance by contacting Cityline. You may incur a violation if you do not call ahead.

- Residents are allowed a maximum of four bulk pickups per year.
- Bulk items cannot be more than two cubic yards (approx. size of your trash and recycling carts side by side). More than two cubic yards may incur a fine.

TIRES

- Residents are allowed a maximum of four tires per household per year.
- You must call Cityline at least two days in advance to request a tire pickup.



SHARPS *Needles, syringes, lancets, etc.*

- Sharps can go in the trash if they are inside a heavy-duty laundry detergent jug with a screw-on cap that is taped shut. Label the container as "sharps." NEVER put sharps in a recycling cart, where they can harm workers and halt the recycling process.

HOW TO MAINTAIN

YOUR YARD

- Grass cannot be taller than 8 inches.
- Littering on streets, sidewalks, parks and even your own property is illegal.
- Graffiti on public or private property is illegal. To learn more about how to apply for public art murals go to art.syr.gov.



YOUR SIDEWALK

- The City has a multi-year planning process relative to the repair and maintenance of City sidewalks.
- Visit syr.gov/sidewalks to learn how to repair or replace your sidewalk and about any associated fees.
- Hazardous sidewalks can be reported to Cityline by using the SYRCityline App. Reports are evaluated and categorized based on severity to ensure critical safety hazards receive priority response
- It is the responsibility of the property owner to remove snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to their property (including corners).
- The City offers supplemental sidewalk clearing along a limited number of priority routes; however, this service does not absolve property owners of their responsibilities.



YOUR SEWER SERVICE

Property owners are responsible for properly maintaining sewer service lines, maintenance and protection of the sewer vent riser and cap, and calling a plumber for blockages.

DO NOT POUR THE FOLLOWING DOWN THE DRAIN

- Cooking or automotive oils
- Grease products
- Hygiene products
- Cigarette butts
- Plastic objects
- Diapers or baby wipes (“flushable” wipes are not flushable)
- Tissues or paper towels
- Anything other than toilet paper & natural human waste



YOUR WATER SERVICE

- Property owners are responsible for city water bills which are sent to them directly. Landlords and tenants should arrange access to billing information if the tenant is responsible per the lease agreement.

QUADRANT PICKUPS

YARD WASTE, CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS AND LEAVES

Please remember to always set yard waste, leaves, trash and construction debris between sidewalk and curb. You must adhere to the following schedule for each special pickup. Failure to comply will result in a citation. Do not set out any materials during a time period not assigned to your quadrant.

YARD WASTE

April - October

Yard waste must be separate from all other waste. Yard waste includes brush, small twigs, branches, limbs, and leaves. Do not block fire hydrants, poles, trees, vents or catch basins. Place your yard waste between sidewalk and curb. If a contractor was used they must remove the debris.

CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

May & September only

You must call Cityline at 315-448-CITY (2489) in advance. If a contractor was used, they must remove the debris. You are allowed a maximum of 2 cubic yards of debris. If you exceed this limit, you may incur a fine. Ensure that your **Construction debris is separated from all other waste. Do not place debris in a bag.** For broken glass or nails, please use a box or bucket that you do not expect to receive back.

LEAVES

November only

Place leaves in paper bags (no plastic bags) in between the sidewalk and curb. If leaves are in the roadway, you may be cited. Do not block fire hydrants, poles, trees, vents or catch basins. If a contractor was used to gather leaves, they must remove the leaves.



WINTER IN SYRACUSE

WINTER PREPARATION

- When clearing driveways, sidewalks, or roofs, avoid burying or damaging electric and natural gas meters, pipes, and vents, as this can disrupt service or cause danger. Keep dryer, furnace, and natural gas vents free of snow to prevent fires or carbon monoxide buildup. If you smell natural gas (rotten egg odor), evacuate and call your utility immediately. Use caution when removing snow from roofs; avoid climbing if possible, use secure ladders, and never work alone.
- Stock flashlights, extra batteries, a battery radio, non-perishable food, bottled water, essential medications, blankets, a first aid kit, a fire extinguisher, and safe heating equipment for emergency use.



SIDEWALKS

- It is the responsibility of the property owner to remove snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to their property (including corners).
- It is illegal to deposit or plow snow into the street, public right-of-way, or sidewalk.
- The City offers supplemental sidewalk clearing along a limited number of priority routes, however, this service does not absolve property owners of their responsibilities.



PARKING

Parking compliance is an important factor in ensuring plows are able to clear roads after a snow event. Illegally parked cars that block plows and emergency vehicles hinder snow clearance, delay first responders, and compromise public safety.

- Observe odd/even parking restrictions on your street to accommodate plows.
- Move vehicles off the street whenever possible during significant snowfall.
- Visit syr.gov/winter to view the list of priority parking enforcement streets.



PLOWING

- Plows focus on clearing primary and service roads for emergency services. Priority areas include high-volume roadways, emergency routes, hills, and major destinations.
- The City, Onondaga County, and New York state collaborate on highways and service roads in Central New York.
- Neighborhood side streets are plowed after major routes are clear and snowfall subsides.
