Servant Leadership Devotional Day 1: At Work

Opening Question

Who are the leaders you look up to most, and what Christlike qualities stand out in them?

Key Passage for the Day

Jesus called them to him and said to them, “You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.” (Mark 10:42–45 ESV)

1. What unhealthy leadership temptation does Jesus expose in this passage?
2. Why does Jesus set a radically different standard for those who follow Him?
3. As Kingdom men, how do we guard our hearts from using position, influence, or authority for selfish gain?

Other Verses for Reflection

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. (Philippians 2:3)

So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets. (Matthew 7:12)

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” (Galatians 5:13–14)

Call to Action

What are two specific ways you can display servant leadership in your workplace today?

Servant Leadership Devotional Day 2: At Home

Opening Question

When you look back at your upbringing, did you witness godly leadership modeled in the home? Why or why not?

Key Passages for the Day

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her... (Ephesians 5:25–27 ESV)

Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. (Ephesians 6:4 ESV)

In Ephesians 5, we are commanded to love our wives like Christ loves the church—sacrificially, intentionally, and consistently. This kind of leadership doesn't demand honor; it earns it by example. God also calls us to shepherd our children with patience, instruction, and grace. One of the most powerful ways to transform the world is to lead and love well within the four walls of our homes. Two simple but profound ways we model Christlike leadership at home are:

1. **Being fully present** — putting aside distractions to give our families our undivided attention.
2. **Speaking life** — using our words to build, bless, and encourage, even when correction is needed.

Other Verses for Reflection

Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way... (1 Peter 3:7)

Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them. (Colossians 3:19)

Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body. (Proverbs 16:24)

Honest Personal Assessment

1. On a scale of 1–10, how well do you give your full attention to your family when you're with them?
2. Are your words in the home typically life-giving or discouraging? What "temperature" are you setting?

Call to Action

What adjustments must you make to lead your family with intentional presence and consistent encouragement?

Prayer

Father, thank You for the gift of my family. Shape my heart to reflect Christ in the way I love, serve, correct, and speak. Help me lead my home with humility and strength. Amen.

Servant Leadership Devotional Day 3: In the Community

Opening Question

Do you view yourself as a spiritual influence in your neighborhood and community? Why or why not?

Key Passage for the Day

“A dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest. And he said to them... ‘I am among you as the one who serves.’” (Luke 22:24–27 ESV)

Many people see leadership as positional — something tied to titles, platforms, or accomplishments. But Jesus shatters that idea. Greatness in the Kingdom is proven through servanthood, compassion, and availability. Every man, regardless of education, background, or status, has the ability to be great because every man can serve. True leadership flows from a heart anchored in Christ.

Other Verses for Reflection

But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart... how does God's love abide in him? (1 John 3:17–18)

Call to Action

1. What gets in the way of you serving others in your community (time, pride, comfort, fear, not knowing where to start)?
2. What is one practical way you can serve someone in your community this week (helping a single parent, assisting the elderly, supporting the poor, mentoring a teen, etc.)?

Prayer

Lord, open my eyes to the needs around me. Give me compassion, courage, and the willingness to serve like Jesus wherever You place me today. Amen.

Servant Leadership Devotional Day 4: In Your Church

Opening Question

How would you describe your current level of connection and involvement in your church?

- b) Rarely miss
- c) Attend 1–2 times per month
- d) Attend only on major holidays

Key Passages for the Day

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works... (Hebrews 10:24–25 ESV)

For just as the body is one and has many members... so it is with Christ. (1 Corinthians 12:12–14 ESV)

One of the most important ways we grow spiritually is by gathering consistently with the Body of Christ. Church is not something we consume; it's a family we commit to. God designed the church so that every believer — with different gifts and strengths — plays a vital role. Serving in the church strengthens the body, blesses others, and matures us. You are not just welcomed into the church — you are *needed* in it.

Other Verses for Reflection

(Acts 2:42–47 — early believers gathering, sharing, serving)

Call to Action

What is one intentional step you can take to deepen your connection at church this week? (Joining a group, serving in a ministry, giving, helping meet needs, etc.)

Prayer

Thank You for the gift of my church, Lord. Help me show up faithfully, serve joyfully, and contribute meaningfully to what You are doing in and through this community. Amen.

Servant Leadership Devotional Day 5: With Your Friends

Opening Question

Do you have surface-level friendships or real brothers who truly know you? How deeply do you invest in your closest friendships?

Key Passages for the Day

Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another. (Proverbs 27:17 ESV)

And the Word became flesh... full of grace and truth. (John 1:14, 16–17 ESV)

Iron sharpening iron requires the right angle and the right pressure. Too much truth without grace crushes a brother. Too much grace without truth keeps him stuck. True biblical friendship balances both — challenging and encouraging, correcting and restoring. This is the kind of brotherhood God designed men to walk in: honest, accountable, grace-filled, truth-centered.

Other Verses for Reflection

A friend loves at all times... (Proverbs 17:17)

Two are better than one... (Ecclesiastes 4:9–10)

Call to Action

If you're not already gathering regularly with 2–4 trustworthy men, write down the names of the brothers you want to build with. Reach out and schedule your first meet-up to pray, share, and sharpen one another.

Prayer

Lord, thank You for the gift of godly friendships. Give me the courage to be real, the humility to receive correction, and the love to sharpen the men I walk with. Amen.
