### **ISAIAH SERIES**

For the rest of the summer, we will be focusing our sermons on selected portions of Isaiah. I know that feels like a punishment to those of you used to only hearing about uplifting gospels and never from the Old Testament but, hear me out. Our primary goal is to create mature disciples. That takes effort, diversity and going deeper into scripture. The themes in Isaiah are profoundly relevant to our culture and daily lives. Isaiah touches on justice, mercy, the holiness of God, hope amidst judgment and trials, as well as connecting the Old and New Testament without too much confusion around God's intentions. The book of Isaiah equips believers to live faithfully in a broken world while longing for the restoration to come. We hope it does the same for you. Here are the scriptures and topics for the first five weeks in case you'd like to read ahead and prepare.

## LEASING OUR WORSHIP SPACE TO ANOTHER CHURCH

We all feel blessed and thankful to have a beautiful sanctuary, Faith Center, classrooms, and meeting rooms – not to mention the many outdoor spaces. We have followed the call to share our resources with others in many ways such as events, schools, Scouts, and other non-profits. And now, we answered the call to share in another way.

Beginning Sunday, June 29, we will be leasing our sanctuary and Faith Center to Church of the King for their Sunday worship services and fellowship. They will be on site from 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm each Sunday.

Church of the King is a non-denominational Christian church, worshiping for nearly 20 years in many different spaces as they grew to over 150 members. Most recently they have been worshiping at a church in Citrus Heights whose needs have grown and now they need their facilities also on Sunday afternoons. We have been thoughtful and prayerful about this new opportunity, and mindful of potential conflicts with Resurrection programming. Our agreement is for a period of six months with the option to extend. The Church of the King pastor and leaders have been here to tour the facilities and review the terms of the agreement. The additional income will be a big plus for LCR, and the use of our facilities will be a blessing for the Church of the King.

As usual, the response to 2 recent Helping Hands appeals have resulted in a huge response! Here is how you have made a difference:



Folsom's Hope received a vast number of supplies for their STARS program. They are moving to a new location and will now be serving students from 2 elementary schools – Theodore Judah and Blanche Sprentz. These supplies were very much appreciated. How much did we give, you ask? Well, here is the list:

72 bags of chips	108 fruit cups	85 fruit snacks
62 packs Cheese Its	16 pack cheese crackers	191 granola bars
9 paper towel rolls	2 lg Lysol wipes	9 soap bars/wipes/dispensers

Next, we supported **St. Vincent de Paul's** quarterly drive for infant/toddler diapers and wipes. Once again, those diapers kept coming in, resulting in:

- 942 diapers
- 116 swaddlers
- Several packages of wipes totaling 324!

That is a huge help to families with little ones and limited resources.

# NEW GRANTS FROM LEGACY AND RESURRECTION LIFE FUNDS

In May, the Legacy Committee approved three grants:

- \$2500 from the Resurrection Life Fund to LCR's 2025-2026 budget. Applied for by Church Council.
- \$600 from the Legacy Fund to Placer County MDIC and Children's Advocacy Center. The funds will be the first donation for the Placer County Child Abuse Prevention Month Resource Fair, scheduled for April 2026. The grant will provide twelve \$25 gas gift cards and six \$50 grocery gift cards for those attending the event. This kind of support from the community reduces family stress, helps fill immediate needs, and fosters emotional well-being for families. Applied for by Vince Dutto and Jessica Waterford, Supervisor of Placer Multi-Disciplinary Interview Center (MDIC) and Children's Advocacy Center.
- \$3000 from the Legacy Fund to Outreach Uganda. The
  grant will go toward funding security fencing for
  dormitory areas of the Cubu Parents Primary School, a
  rural school in Agwata, Uganda. Applied for by Carol
  Davis, founder of Outreach Uganda and a member of
  the LCR Social Ministry Team. LCR Helping Hands for
  June also benefitted students via Outreach Uganda.
