YOUTH & FAMILY – January Updates & Info

Happy (almost) New Year! As 2025 ends and we step into a new year, my prayer can best be summed up in the words of Henri Nouwen, that we would “Live each day as full of promises. Imagine that we could walk through the new year always listening to a voice saying to us: I have a gift for you and can’t wait for you to see it!”. I’m excited to see all that this year has in store for us all, and so grateful that I get to serve your families. Here are a few updates for January as well as some dates to keep in mind for this quarter:

Sunday School/Confirmation: This Sunday, January 4th, we will begin having Youth & Children connect groups from 10am-10:30am. Youth (middle and high school) will gather in room 14 and Children will gather in room 10. Middle and high school students will engage in faith conversations and activities; these will include confirmation topics. For now, we will not be having a separate Confirmation program, rest assured students currently going through Confirmation will still receive adequate knowledge to meet goals for Confirmation. Our younger students will likewise engage in faith formation activities such as games, arts and crafts, and stories of faith.



JANUARY HELPING HANDS

The holidays are behind us, and after the rush of providing holiday meals, many food banks struggle to meet the increasing need of families straining to feed themselves. Help restock the shelves of **two local food banks** by bringing in non-perishable food items during the month of January. **Twin Lakes Food Bank** Folsom, El Dorado Hills, and Granite Bay. **Orangevale-Fair Oaks Food Bank** serves Orangevale, Fair Oaks, Folsom and Citrus Heights.

Most needed items include:

- Beans, rice, dry pasta
- Canned main dishes (stew, chili w/meat, ravioli)
- Canned fruits & vegetables
- Peanut butter
- Tomato products (sauce, diced, stewed)
- Healthy cereals
- Oatmeal
- Canned meats (tuna, chicken)
- Canned soups
- Nutritional drinks (Ensure, etc)



It is as simple as the next time you are at the grocery store, pick up a few of these items, and then bring them to church on Sunday. Leave them in the Helping Hands baskets in the sanctuary narthex or the Faith Center lobby, or in the church office during the week. Any financial donations will be sent to Feeding the Foothills (formerly Placer Food Bank).

Together, we will help single mothers, families, and seniors who struggle to make ends meet to feed themselves and their families.

COUNCIL CORNER

The Vision and strategic planning team presented a great overview of the preliminary vision and strategy report. A huge thank-you from the council to the team for the incredible work that has been done so far. Council then received a copy of the report with some homework to review and provide feedback to the team by December 22nd.

The November finances showed an increase in year-end giving which pushed our year-to-date net to a positive \$5,000. We did not have any significant unexpected maintenance expenses in November but are still trying to get quotes for replacing 2 larger HVAC systems in the faith center which are expected to be in the range of \$50-60k each. There are a few smaller HVAC systems that are not working properly as well in the faith center. Other upcoming larger expenses will be parking lot repairs and Faith center carpet. The sanctuary flood on Dec 25th also created some additional expenses for clean-up.

A two-year contract extension was signed with the Christ the King church to continue leasing our facilities which will give us ability to do some long-term budget planning to utilize the additional income.

The staff appreciation brunch for the Resurrection staff was appreciated and enjoyed by staff and council. Much of the excellent food was provided by resurrection members.
