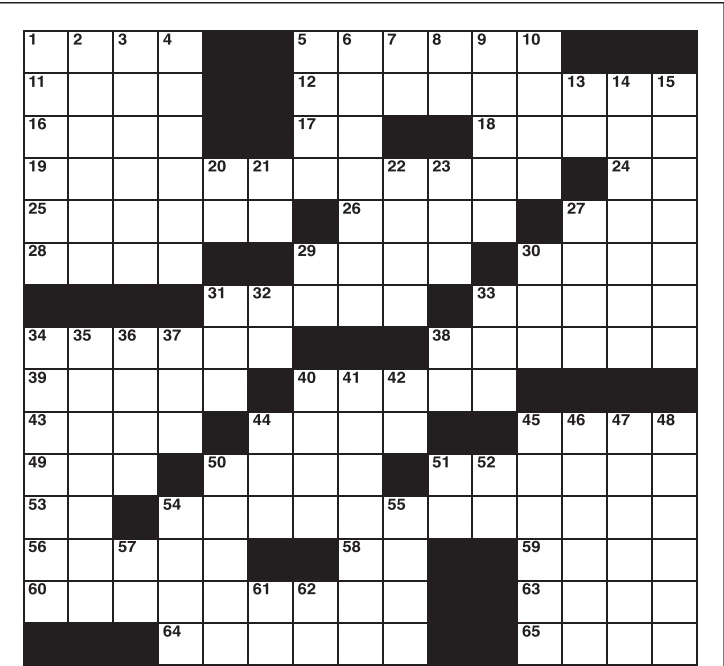

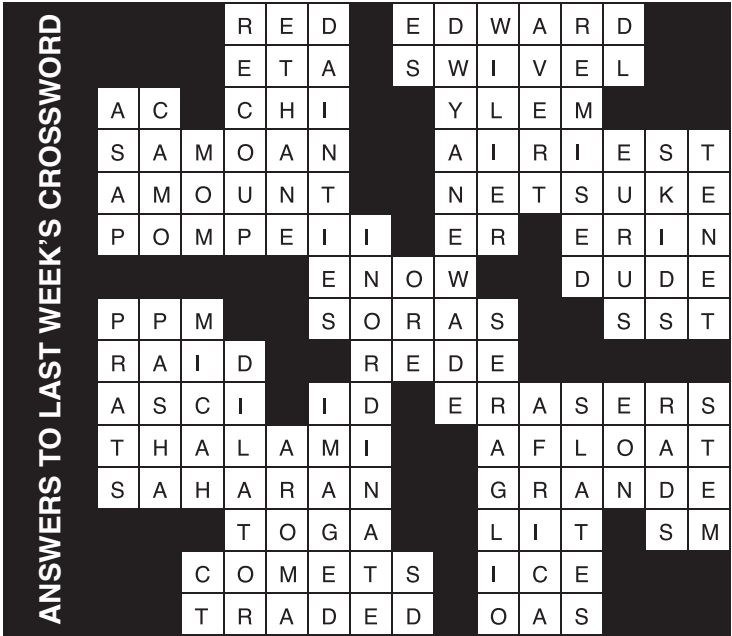

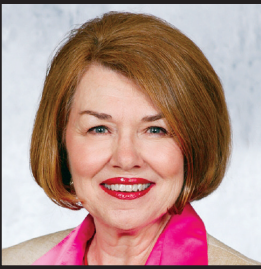

Dover Buys Mower, Software Upgrade in Phases

The Town of Dover Mayor and Aldermen met May 14, at City Hall. All members were in attendance, except Robert “Boo” Beecham. Also in attendance were City Attorney Larry Watson, and employees Carla Anderson and Jeff Brigham. The first order of business was the purchase of a new mower. Bids came in and the lowest bid, which the board approved, was a 72” cut Kubota, 30hp diesel mower with a service agreement for \$17,642. Brigham said the City utilizes equipment as long as possible, and one piece dates back to the 70s. Mayor Lesa Fitzhugh said, “It amazes me how long our employees keep equipment running before coming to us. We’ve got a great group of employees.” Wallace added she appreciated employees working extra hard on the City Park leading up to Eagle

Fest. In other business, Ordinance 423-18, passed on the second reading, regarding beer sales restrictions. Ordinance 424-18, amending zoning classifications on Colson Rd. passed on the second reading. Ordinance 425-18, regarding the 2017-2018 budget amendments passed on first reading. Amendments included increases in tools needed, police car repairs, other repairs and maintenance, and increases in water and sewer projects (including the booster station at Wildlife Rd. Hidden Valley project, water tank rehabs, and buying water from Cumberland City. Ordinance 426-18, adoption of the annual budget and tax rate for FY 2018-2019 was approved. There will be no tax, water or sewer increases with this budget. It includes performance raises, the tractor, a borer machine and software upgrade. Wallace said the City may not be able to get the grant money expected for the software

upgrade, and has not signed the contract yet. “I would really like to see us move forward with this, even if we have to do it in phases,” Wallace said. “If we leave the money in there, maybe we can do it in phases. It’s not increasing our taxes, it’s not increasing our water bills.” Both Wallace and Fitzhugh said the software upgrade would save the City both time and money. The board agreed to leave the funds in the budget set aside for the upgrade, 75% would come out of the general fund, and some would come out of the water and sewer fund. The last order of business was the classification of “uncollectible taxes” on properties that had passed the state’s statute of limitations, which was approved. There was no other business, and the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting is scheduled for June 18 at 6 pm.

SC Schools are *StormReady*

Friday, May 18, SC Schools received the official designation from the National Weather Service as “storm ready”. Krissy Hurley, Warning Coordination Meteorologist with the National Weather Service (NWS) Nashville, was on hand, as was SC Emergency Management Director, Clint Mathis, and SC Schools Safety Director Steve Nolen. The certificate was presented to SC Director of Schools, Leta Joiner. The county went through the process in 2011, and was designated a storm ready county then. NWS is working with TN school districts to make sure they are ready in the event a tornado moves through. Hurley said, “Stewart Co. is #8 in Tennessee to achieve this status,” and commended Joiner, Mathis and respective staff on what they are already doing. “Stewart Co. is one of the most proactive systems in Tennessee,” Hurley said. Nolen said individual schools in the system had been conducting safety training, and Hurley

explained key factors for preparedness include: drills, weather radios, training, and a good relationship with NWS. Hurley explained information, awareness and approaches to safety have come a long way since students lined school hallways and covered their heads, in emergencies. “We learned, maybe hallways aren’t the safest location,” Hurley said, and named two incidences: Enterprise, AL 2007, and Moore, OK, 2013. She explained the best options are to, “stay away from windows and exit doors.” Nolen said, “The kids are sheltered in a different location, now.” He added, his team has worked to install internal antennas, and administrators are armed with portable devices, so they can be alerted when severe weather is predicted or arises. Both Nolen and Mathis said training is annual, and ongoing. Hurley said, “This school district has gone the extra mile to be as prepared as they can be.” Mathis said when severe weather is predicted, NWS warns him days in

advance, and he works closely with Joiner and Nolen, who in turn begin to activate a plan. “We drill down the details, and then Ms. Leta can use that information to make a decision as whether she’s going to close school that day, or dismiss early,” Mathis said. Principals are notified, they execute emergency plans in each of the schools, and each teacher has a designated sheltering location for students. Nolen said, “Four minutes is what they shoot

for. It usually takes two to three minutes.” Bus drivers receive training as well. Joiner said SC school personnel went to Dickson County and trained with them, as their drivers actually experienced this. “They had to evacuate their bus, and so it got us thinking, we need to have plans for that as well. It’s not ideal, but find a place, if it’s a church, or business, if not a house,” Joiner said. SC school’s designation is good through May 2023.

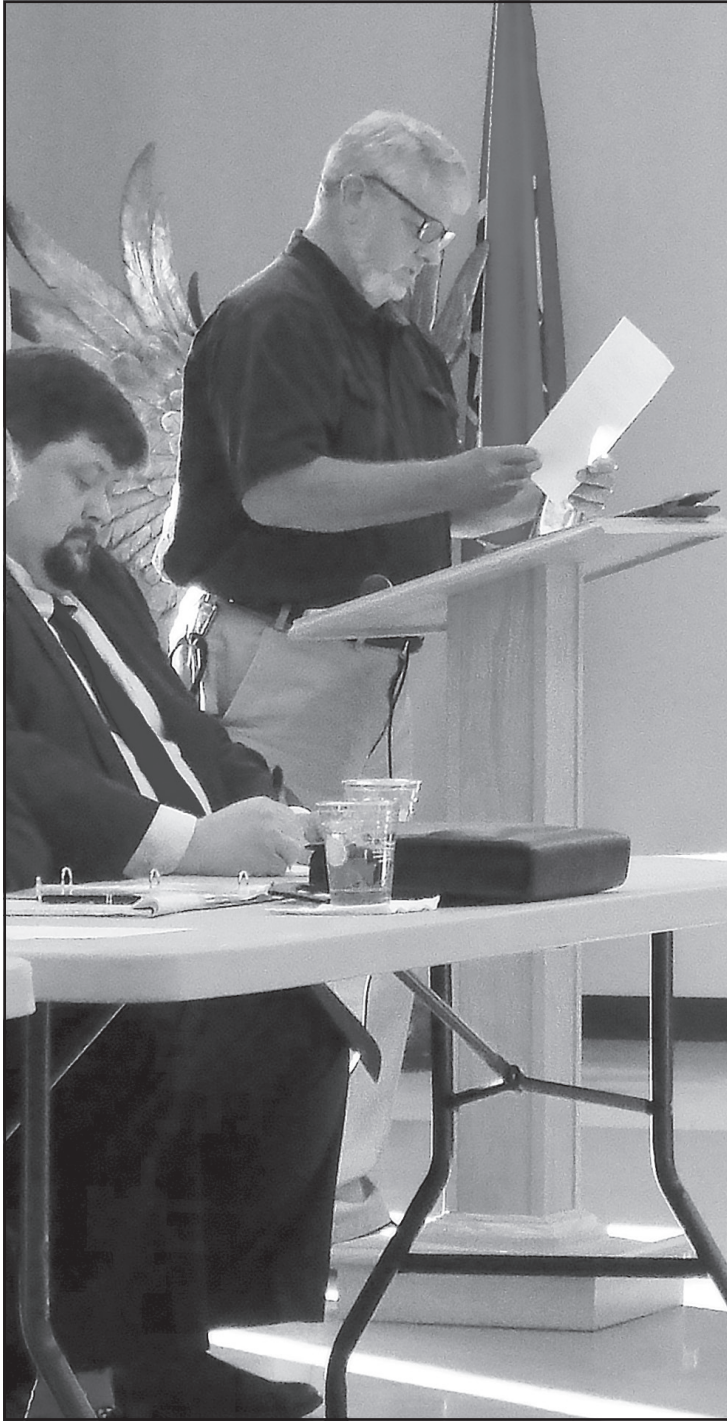
David Ross was able to make it to the forum after it had started. Incumbent Mayor Rick Joiner was not in attendance but provided his responses in writing, they were not read at the

forum but were placed on the table for anyone in attendance to read. Candidates were asked nine questions which had been provided to them before the forum. Stewart Co. citizen Dave Vance, headed the meeting. The questions for the candidates were, 1. What is your vision for Stewart Co.? 2.

How do you plan to reduce the county’s debt? 3. How much of our county budget comes from federal and state dollars? 4. What is your plan for job growth? 5. What are you going to do when TVA goes away to make up for the revenue shortfall? 6. What will you do to stop the use of tax revenue to purchase and

transfer Stewart Co. land to the Dept. of Interior? (Many candidates didn’t fully understand questions 6 or 7) 7. Will you support the development of written bylaws and will you enforce adherence? 8. How will you deal with the conflict of interest caused by nepotism in Stewart Co. government? 9. What steps will you take to create a culture of transparency and accountability in our local government? Each candidate was given two minutes for an introduction and two minutes to answer each question. They were then given one minute for closing remarks. There were only two questions posed by the audience after the forum, from George Mauldin and the Standard.

Vance opened the meeting saying, there is not any debate between the candidates and any questions from the audience would not be until the end if time allows and would have to be directed at all the candidates. After the meeting, we asked some attendees for comment. Stewart County resident Misty Kinney said when asked what she liked the most, “Transparency, that’s the main thing that stuck out to me. Because I think if we start with transparency everything else is going to fall in line at some point.” Business owner Chris Barrett said, “My take from it was, they all have some level of care, they all want to be held accountable for their decisions. As far as just a specific take away from it, I liked the two questions on the fly. The

two questions asked and the answers given at the end.” When asked which ones specifically, he said, “George’s question on the fly and yours. Because it wasn’t scripted, they didn’t have time to think about it. Before those questions, I personally thought, based on what was said here tonight, two people really separated themselves and really pulled away from the crowd, and answering the

questions on the fly they did the same thing again.” Barrett wouldn’t say which two he thought had pulled away in his opinion. Others in attendance said they would like to see a debate. We will present part of each candidate’s intro and abridged answers to some of the questions in next week’s Standard, as well as more from the audience in attendance.
