Campus: We are able to have our All Ability individuals at three high schools and two middle school campuses. Each huddle has a leadership team of student athletes that has a representative that serves as our all ability rep. We have supported those leaders with training and tools that will help our all ability friends not just attend but belong and understand at their cognitive level what the speaker is sharing at any given time during the week. We are always refining this as each athlete has different needs. Please pray over this as it does require the special education teacher and para to be on board with getting our all ability athletes to the campus huddle. We have some amazing teachers and paras that support this, but some are for sure resistant. Each school continues to grow in their understanding of our all ability friends and it is our prayer that throughout the week, our typical friends are bringing their all ability friends along with them to lunch and activities.
