- (Cafetorium addition at intermediate









In early 2025, Snyder ISD formed a Facilities Assessment Committee of more than 25 parents, staff, educators, business owners, civic leaders, and community members. The group met monthly to tour campuses, review building conditions, and discuss long-term needs, with a focus on safety and instructional effectiveness.

Based on the committee's findings, the Snyder ISD Board of Trustees unanimously voted to call a \$170.9 million bond election.

If approved by voters, the proposed bond is designed to:

- Improve safety and security across campuses
- Update aging facilities and infrastructure
- Expand accessibility and opportunities for all students
