

Shepherd's Thoughts

On Christmas Eve-Christ, Our Eucharistic Joy - Anticipating the joy of receiving Christ in the Eucharist. - Praying for a heart filled with joy as we celebrate the birth of the Eucharistic Lord.

Good is good, all the time! All the time, God is God!

As we gather on this last day of our preparations for the Birth of Christ, we also celebrate the Ninth Day Novena in honor of our Expectant Mother that her Child, Jesus, be born to us! I'm sure our hearts are filled with anticipation and great joy burning with love and echoing the sentiments of King David in our first reading today (2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16). "The kingdom of David shall endure forever before the Lord." This proclamation sets the stage for our reflection on Christ, Our Eucharistic Joy, revealed in the mystery of Christmas.

Our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, 29) resonates with the assurance that we will sing of the goodness of the Lord forever. The mystery of God's plan, hidden for ages, is unveiled in our second reading (Romans 16:25-27). The long-awaited promise is about to be fulfilled, and the joy of this revelation is about to burst forth.

In the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:26-38), we witness the Annunciation Moment when the angel Gabriel declares to Mary that she will conceive and bear a son. This miraculous event marks the beginning of the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Savior. In the birth of Jesus, we find the source of our Eucharistic joy and the true source of happiness in celebrating another Christmas!

As we approach the celebration of the Eucharist, let us recognize the profound connection between Christmas and the Eucharist. The fullness of our yearly celebrations at Christmas centers on the Eucharist where we re-encounter the Baby Jesus as we behold and receive Him in Holy Communion- THE BODY OF CHRIST. In the same way that Christ took on flesh in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. to dwell among us, continues to be present among us in the Eucharist. Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

The joy we experience at Christmas is a foretaste of the joy we find in the Eucharist. The mystery of God's plan, hidden for ages, is manifested in the Eucharistic celebration, where we encounter the living Christ. In receiving the Eucharist, we share in the divine joy of Christ's presence, and now become part of our daily lives, fulfilling the promise of everlasting joy proclaimed in our psalm.

As we celebrate the birth of the Eucharistic Lord, let us pray for hearts to be filled with joy that they may experience the joy of Christmas extended into our Eucharistic celebrations. where we encounter the living Christ, and may this joy permeate our lives, bringing hope, peace, and love to a world in need. Amen.


