

## Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

Patrick Peyton, CSC (January 9, 1909 – June 3, 1992), also known as "The rosary priest", was an Irish-born Catholic priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross, and founder of the Family Rosary Crusade. He popularized the phrase, "The family that prays together stays together". This links us to the idea of how Mary and Joseph introduced Jesus and taught him to learn their customs in the context of the human family.

The feast of the Holy Family is celebrated yearly within the Octave of Christmas that manifested how God originally designed and highlighted the joyous birth of his only begotten Son. This celebration reminds us of his divine plan to model our families after the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. God's invitation to this continual encounter with his only begotten Son is extended to us by fulfilling all the prescriptions of the law as the Holy Family normally did, "they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, for every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord."

Our Sunday obligation urges us to do the same and be generous enough by sharing our time, talents and treasures in thanking God for all the blessings we received. Always remember: no one Continue...

who is so rich that has nothing in need and no one who is so poor that has nothing to give.

I understand, we are running out of priestly and religious vocations. That is, I think, one of the reasons why we have missionaries in our Diocese. As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, God once again re-invites you to share vocations. It is for this noble purpose why parents are gifted with children not only for their own sake but also to perpetuate the mission of God by offering your sons and daughters to the Lord.

I thank God for having such generous parishioners like you. Continue such wonderful blessings to our parish. I hope I'm not pampering you much with that. But still I'm appealing to you to share vocations. Families are the hope of our Church. You can start promoting vocations by leading your children going to Church and help them appreciate the Holy Eucharist. Let them continue to encounter Christ through the sacraments. Just present them to the Lord! In fact it's God's own decision whom he will choose. "Many are called but few are chosen". The Scripture verse from the Book of Proverbs (Proverbs 22:6) states: "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it. Your home is a seedbed for vocations. Mary's Fiat " or "Yes " to God's invitation brought God's divine plan into a reality and Joseph's unwavering faith made him steadfast for the well-being of his family. Because of their obedience and faithfulness to God the Father, the child, Jesus also grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

Just as the Holy Family found strength in their unity, let our families find strength in the Eucharist, where we encounter the real presence of Christ and to other sacraments. May the Holy Family inspire us to say "yes" to God's plan in our lives as we journey together as families in faith. As we celebrate this feast, let us strive to emulate the virtues of the Holy Family, making the Eucharist the center of our lives for the well-being of our families. In doing so, may our families, like the Holy Family, be sanctuaries of love where union of husband and wife is sanctified, trust is fostered and communion is strengthened.

On this Feast of the Holy Family, we reflect on the significance of the family as a domestic Church where the Eucharist Lord is first encountered and forgiveness is first experienced. The Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, serves as a model for our own families, and their life provides beautiful insights towards appreciation of the sacraments and realization of becoming open to respond to God's call.

As we ponder the Holy Family's journey, may we see this moment of profound trust and obedience. Mary's fiat to God's plan, echoes in the Eucharist. As we say "yes" too to receive the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharistic, may we also learn this sacred moment to say "yes" by promoting vocations and be part in carrying God's plan.


