

Shepherd's Thoughts

"SALUBONG": An Encounter of the Risen Christ and the Blessed Mother, Mary (A Filipino Way of Celebrating Easter Sunday leading to First Easter Morning Eucharist Celebration)

The Filipino Roman Catholic Believers have a unique way of Celebrating Easter. On Sunday of Easter, at dawn, almost all are excited going to Church to witness the "Salubong". It is an Easter Tradition in the Philippines that reenacts the meeting of the Risen Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary, his Mother, on the First Easter morning. There is no biblical account of this meeting, but this remains as an Oral Tradition, sacred. What we only have in the Bible (Written Tradition), as proofs that Jesus has truly been raised from the dead are as follows: the Empty Tomb, the Appearance and Announcement of the Angel, Jesus' Appearance to Mary Magdalene and the Appearance of Jesus to his Apostles with their testimonies. The Magisterium of the Church (Authority Teaching of the Church) is also telling us that all these proofs serve as the bases of our belief that Jesus has truly risen on the third day after his suffering and death on the

Our Sacred Tradition explains to us that, if Jesus has been raised from the dead and truly appeared to Mary Magdalene and to his Apostles, isn't it that it's impossible that Jesus did not appear to his mother? Thus, the "Salubong" (A Filipino word used to describe the meeting between two or more persons at a certain time an in a certain place) gives highlight to this meeting between the Resurrected Christ and his mother depicted by short processions of the two images which come from opposite directions, thus the encounter. On this celebration, an Easter Angel plays an important role, representing the Angel on the resurrection account, who appeared and announced to Mary Magdalene and to his Apostles the good news that Jesus is risen! There are other angels who deliver speeches, called "dichos" telling the Blessed Mother and the faithful at the same time to rejoice and be glad.

In the Philippines, you can see in almost all Roman Catholic Churches the so called "castillo" or resurrection castle or Easter tower, where the Easter Angel is readied and awaiting until the procession is done, and goes down to unveil the statue of the Blessed Mother [that is facing the statue of the Risen Christ]. This symbolizes the taking off the grief that pierced the heart of the Sorrowing Mother and the shedding off of the sinfulness of humanity; that she may see the glorious wonders of the Risen Christ, his Son; and the turning of her tears of sorrow into joy because her Son, Jesus has truly been raised from the dead.

On this holy encounter, as the Easter Angel unveils the statue of the Blessed Mother, all the other angels sing Alleluia! Alleluia! Fear not, for the Lord has truly risen! In some instances, this reenactment of the encounter is done inside the Church if some parishes don't have yet a resurrection castle or Easter tower. An elevated platform is assembled where an angel can stand firmly to unveil the statue of the Blessed Mother. After this reenactment of Encounter the usual celebration of the Holy Mass follows. Fr.
