

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good! As we celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent we reflect on the revealed glory of Jesus as He transfigured before Peter, James and John, (Mk 9:2-10), "Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus."

Every time I read this Gospel text I always remember when I went to the Holy Land for a pilgrimage and retreat with my fellow Filipino priests in 2014. It was really an extraordinary faith experience for me in Mt. Tabor where I felt a moment of peace in my heart and tranquility in my soul. I might have taken the place of Peter when he was with Jesus a thousand years ago, and thus he even said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

Brothers and sisters, and to those who might have loosen their faith, always go back to your own personal faith experience where you had this encounter with Jesus, so that you might be renewed, re-energized and revitalized.

We might not have a chance of going to the Holy Land but there is always God who reveals His glory right in here, in our midst especially as we celebrate the Holy Eucharist. We can hear his voice and He speaks to us in the liturgy of the Word, we can see Him in the consecration as the priest lifted up his Body and Blood and we can touch Him every time we receive Communion! Thank God for this Mt. Tabor experience in the Holy Mass. Invite also your family and friends so they might also experience God's revelation of Himself through His words and the breaking of the Bread.

The call of father Abraham in the first reading from the Book of Genesis also speaks of this same faith experience, his personal encounter with God, when he sacrificed his son to the Lord. (Gn22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18). "God put Abraham to the test and said, "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust." So it happened and he built an altar to offer his son. And God said, "because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore."

Our forefathers, not only Abraham, prepared everything for us to have this kind of good and meaningful life. Our life now is just a continuation of the gratuitous gifts that we have inherited from our parents and great-great grandparents. Thus, this is the right moment now to repay them with kindness by simply witnessing and transmitting the faith that we have inherited from them.

By bringing your sons and daughters to the Church, you are already offering them to God, and you are leading them to also experience the glory of God. Like Abraham he did not withhold his beloved son, Isaac from the Lord." If you are so obedient to God's will, you will surely be blessed.

The same message is conveyed upon us all in the second reading today (Rom 8:31b-34) "He who did not spare his own Son, but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? God gave us everything even his only begotten Son until death, death on the cross. He shared with his glory. We may also learn to voluntarily submit ourselves to God's divine will and be generous in sharing what we have. Fr. Antonio Rex M. Palaya
