



# Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

Why do we need to take a rest? It's simply because sometimes we get tired. "For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and everything that is in them, and He rested on the seventh day; for that reason the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex 20:11).

Who among us here keeps on complaining that he or she is already tired of doing things in life? Don't blame God or anyone for that. It's one's fault anyway for not taking enough time to take a rest. God has already made a friendly day for all of us since the beginning of the world. If you can afford to work eight hours a day from Monday through Friday, why don't you give yourself enough time to rest with the Lord?

Today's gospel also speaks of Jesus' pastoral works. He cured Simon's mother-in-law who was sick, he drove out demons, cured many who were sick with various diseases and visited other villages to preach. Jesus himself said, "For this purpose have I come." (Mk. 1:29-39). Jesus also got tired being human but he always gave time to pray, "Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed". This is the main point now that we have to learn from him. We may get tired of doing many things for our family and our future but never cease praying and giving time with the Lord.

I would rather understand people who can't go to Church because they find it necessary to work for food than for someone who has enough in life and yet doesn't have time with the Lord. Be thankful to God if you are already secured with your own family at home. If you feel convenient with your comforter to make you warm in a cold winter day and night, remember also the homeless who have nothing to lay their head to during the night. When you eat sumptuously, think also of those who have nothing to eat. When you spend a lot of money on your own, share also some to those in need and if you have a lot of leisure time to enjoy with your family and friends take also into account those people who are in grief because of their loss and trying times.

I do understand that we arduously work to earn money for our family and to provide them with a better future. But we should not also forget our ecclesial responsibility as stated in the precepts of the Church, that is to provide for the needs of the Church.

Bishop's appeal is a concrete expression of complying to our obligations to the Church. As we support the Bishop's Appeal, we also participate in the pastoral ministry of Jesus Christ through the diocesan mission and ministries. Be thankful if the Bishop is appealing to you for a cause because he values your worth. It would be more distressful on our part if he doesn't involve us anymore as if there is a feeling that we are no longer part of the life and mission of the Church. If I were to ask from God, I would rather pray to Him if He could multiply a hundredfold those cheerful givers so there will be more generous who could unconditionally share their blessings to those in need.
