

Shepherd's Thoughts

Important updates and reminders for proper and worthy celebrations of the Holy Week:

Holy Week must be given higher importance among other weeks in a year. It is with great reverence and solemn observance that the whole Catholic Christian families should give priority to our Parish and Church activities. It is highly encouraged that an individual or family should visit other Churches instead of just going out for leisure or amusement. Other acts of piety and sacrifices within this Holy Week are very much helpful for spiritual growth and personal sanctification.

Palm Sunday recalls the story in Sacred Scripture of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, greeted by people waving palm branches praising "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Hosanna in the highest. It is a reminder for us Catholic Christians to welcome Jesus into our hearts and be willing to face suffering and death in following him. It is therefore necessary to have at least one procession in each parish before the Holy Mass. (If possible, the blessing of the palm starts at the entrance of the Church or in a suitable place to highlight the reenactment of Jesus' entry to Jerusalem with a procession going to Church- it is recommended to use the basement for postoral reasons).

It is also within this day that the Passion of Jesus is read. If done in a narrative way, Christ's part must be read by the priest not by the deacon or lay and a brief homily follows.

As part of our Parish Activity, everyone, in and out of our parish, is encouraged to attend the Parish Lenten Retreat at 6:00-8pm (Brussels Church). It is in this period of time that as one community of believers in Christ, we are one in the spirit of prayer and moment of reflections as we prepare ourselves for the Paschal Triduum of the Church.

Holy Thursday marks the beginning of the Paschal Triduum which highlighted the Celebration of the Lord's Supper. Within the Mass, the newly blessed sacred oils by the Bishop during the Chrism Mass is offered before the singing of the "Gloria" to let the people know and understand their importance as we use them for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Sacred Ordinations and for the Anointing of the sick.

After the homily follows the washing of the feet of the 12 Apostles demonstrating the importance of humility and service by remembering Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. The celebration continues with the usual flow of the Holy Mass but will end up with the Eucharistic procession inside the Church towards the altar of reposition where people can extend silent and personal prayer and reflection. After this celebration, the altar is stripped, if possible cross is removed, Church bells are kept and will not be rung until the Easter Vigil Mass. It is expedient that the cross and other statues remaining in the Church be veiled.

Good Friday commonly called the Friday of the Passion of the Lord. It is a Catholic Christian Tradition commemorating the crucifixion and death of Jesus at Mt. Calvary. It is observed during this moment of grief the adoration of the Holy Cross. After the Adoration follows the intercessions and the Holy Land Collection. Holy communion is also served to the people who are present in this celebration. The liturgy ends with concluding prayer without the final blessing and leaving the Church in silence. It is important to note that there will be no flowers and other decorations on the altar to let the people feel the sense of loss and sorrow on death of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Black Saturday- In a predominantly Catholic Christian Country, Philippines, this day commemorates the day that Jesus laid in his tomb and remains the whole day for personal reflections.

On Easter Vigil, the liturgy highlights the anticipation of Christ's Glorious Resurrection which starts with the blessing of fire with the light of Christ to curse darkness, the celebration of the Liturgy of the Word, blessing of water and renewal of baptismal promises (proper only to the newly baptized) and profession of faith by all baptized into Christ.

Mass intentions for Easter Vigil should be for the newly baptized alone and it is not a good practice to accept other intentions on this celebration. Same with the intentions on Holy Thursday which is only proper for Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious and for vocations.

What is Easter? Easter is the principal of all the holidays and solemnities of Christianity. It marks the Resurrection of Jesus three days after his death by crucifixion. For many Christian churches, Easter is the joyful end to the Lenten season of fasting and penitence. It is the Feast of Feasts, a Solemnity of all Solemnities. Thus, the center of the Catholic Christian Faith.

This year in our parish communities, we will experience a special Easter Sunday Liturgy with "Salubong" or Encounter before the Holy Mass. It is a unique way of Celebrating the Solemnity of the Resurrection of Christ on the first Easter Morning which highlights the meeting or encounter of Christ and the Blessed Mother.

Towards the end of the reenactment, after all the angels have spoken and the black veil has been removed from the Blessed Virgin Mary, the priest will bless the angels and the people, then follow the Eucharistic Celebration.
