



CURSILLO

Christ and his Church need spiritually formed leaders for today's Catholic apostolate. One means of finding inspiration and direction for Christian formation and growth is the <u>Cursillo</u>. Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning "little" or "short course". It is a world-wide movement of the Catholic Church and is supported by our Green Bay Diocese. The Cursillo deals primarily with the fundamentals of Christianity; a growth in knowledge, awareness and love of God, neighbor and the world.

Joining the Cursillo movement starts with individuals attending a weekend gathering. Fifteen talks are given by laypeople, priests and deacons. Everyone who comes is welcome to participate in the discussion of those talks and all activities as they wish. A Cursillo can be made only once in a lifetime and is only the beginning of the Cursillo experience and movement. Regular "4th day" meetings occur throughout our diocese (including in Brussels on a weekly basis) and is a reunion where continued growth and greater community impact happens. To date, Brussels has over 12 Cursillistas and continues growing. We would love to welcome more to the movement!

There is a men's and women's Cursillo weekend held every spring and fall. If you are interested to learn more about the movement or our local group in Brussels, please reach out to Jared Spude (or contact the Parish Office). If you sign up to attend this wonderful spiritual experience, the Parish will pay your registration fee.

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good! During the stations of the cross we always pray, We adore you O Christ and we praise you, because by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world. It is also with this sign of the cross that we are marked as Catholic Christians when we are baptized. But how do we live up our life with the significance of these two dimensions of the holy cross?

Look at that holy cross, you will notice that there is a vertical and a horizontal dimension. Its vertical dimension symbolizes our love for God. It emphasizes our connection and relationship to God the Father through Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit.

Jesus did not die for His own sake! He died precisely for the salvation of mankind. Look at His hands, open handed and horizontally outstretched to all humanity. It is a perfect manifestation of his love for us. This horizontal dimension of the cross symbolizes our love for our neighbors, our connection to one another, our relationship as brothers and sisters

In those days, God delivered all these commandments to Moses (Ex 20:1-3, 7-8, 12-17): 1. I, the LORD am your God, you shall not have other gods besides me. 2. You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. 3. Remember to keep holy the sabbath day.

4. Honor your father and your mother. 5. You shall not kill. 6. You shall not commit adultery. 7. You shall not steal. 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

Moses formally introduced to us the Ten Commandments. But, Jesus summarizes the Ten Commandments into two greatest commandments: the love of God which is referring to the first three Commandments of God and the love of neighbors that refers to the fourth to the tenth Commandments! He made this easy for us, so as to fully understand what is really meant by his Commandment of love.

And because of this love, he has to die but on the third day he will rise again. As Jesus himself said in the Gospel today, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days? But he was speaking about the temple of his body. (Jn 2:13-25). The body that was hung on the cross for our salvation.

It is with this significant history of salvation, that we, as Catholic Christians, celebrate annually with the Holy Week to remind us of this commandment of love of Jesus and of our commitment to be faithful in observing the commandments of God. Fr. Antonio Rex M. Palaya
