

CURSILLO

Christ and his Church need spiritually formed leaders for today's Catholic apostolate. One means of finding inspiration and direction for Christian formation and growth is the <u>Cursillo</u>. Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning "little" or "short course". It is a world-wide movement of the Catholic Church and is supported by our Green Bay Diocese. The Cursillo deals primarily with the fundamentals of Christianity; a growth in knowledge, awareness and love of God, neighbor and the world.

Joining the Cursillo movement starts with individuals attending a weekend gathering. Fifteen talks are given by laypeople, priests and deacons. Everyone who comes is welcome to participate in the discussion of those talks and all activities as they wish. A Cursillo can be made only once in a lifetime and is only the beginning of the Cursillo experience and movement. Regular "4th day" meetings occur throughout our diocese (including in Brussels on a weekly basis) and is a reunion where continued growth and greater community impact happens. To date, Brussels has over 12 Cursillistas and continues growing. We would love to welcome more to the movement!

There is a men's and women's Cursillo weekend held every spring and fall. If you are interested to learn more about the movement or our local group in Brussels, please reach out to Jared Spude (or contact the Parish Office). If you sign up to attend this wonderful spiritual experience, the Parish will pay your registration fee.

Shepherd's Thoughts

In today's liturgy of the word, we focus our reflections on the reality of sin, punishment, forgiveness and love.

Sin as we all know is the root cause of all our human sufferings. Sin is not just private. It has always had its social dimension. Sin can be committed by the community. When sin enters into the world, there begins the punishment of God. When our first parents Adam and Eve committed sin, as punishment for their disobedience, God banished them from Paradise. Because of that, our human nature is still wounded by their own first sin.

What do we expect after all the people's transgressions to God in the first reading? "They mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy (2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23). We cannot escape from the wrath of God. Punishment is God's way of revealing his justice. It is also his way of teaching us lessons to learn from our old sinful ways and to walk humbly before God.

God is indeed loving and forgiving. The wrath of God may just seem to disappear whenever we turn to him full of repentance. This is precisely the weakness of God. Once he forgives he forgets. His forgiveness indicates how he restores everything for us.

Paul in his letter to the Ephesians conveyed upon us this same message, "Brothers and sisters, God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved (Eph 2:4-10).

God wants to reestablish for us this covenant of love and to restore our lasting friendship with him that is why he sent us his only begotten Son that the world might be saved through him. (Jn 3:14-21).

During the Papacy of St. John Paul II, the World Youth Day 1995 was held in the Philippines. Today's Gospel was reechoed then and the whole world was reminded of the unconditional love of God, the Father with its Theme Song: Tell the world of his love. Here's the lyrics of the song.

For God so loved the world, He gave us his only Son. Jesus Christ, our Savior, his most precious one. He has sent us His message of love and sends those who hear, to bring the message to everyone, in a voice loud and clear.

Let us tell the world of His love. The greatest love the world has known. Search the world for those who have walked astray and lead them home.

Fill the world's darkest corners, with his light from up above. Walk every step, Every mile, every road, and tell the world, tell the world of his love.
