Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good! Luke being the author of the Acts of the Apostles gives us an idealized description of early Christians community life. They were one in common in heart and mind witnessing the resurrection of Jesus and doing good works for all (Acts 4:32-35).

Our second reading today was written about 100 AD and is one of the last New Testament books to be composed. This letter was written in the tradition of the Apostolic John and thus bears his name. Today's passage from the near end of this brief letter treats the fundamentals of Christian life. If we love God we will also keep his commandments and love the children of God And whoever is begotten by God conquers the world by faith. (Jn 5:1-6).

In the Gospel today, we are reminded of the necessity of personal encounter with Jesus especially when we are in doubt to believe in Him. He is present in our daily celebration of the Holy Eucharist, believe in him, behold him, touch him and receive him wholeheartedly, don't be unbelieving but believe because Jesus is real. He is alive in our midst.

But for you my brothers and sisters who are already believers in Christ, continue bringing the good news that Jesus is risen. Be like the other disciples who strongly professed, "We have seen the Lord."

As we celebrate this Second Sunday within the octave of Easter, we also remember the significant encounter between Jesus and his doubting apostle Thomas, "Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" (Jn 20:19-31).

As St. Bernadette of Soubirous said, "for those who believe in God no explanation is necessary, but those who don't none will suffice". Indeed, our faith should not rely only on what we see but we must depend on God's to accept by heart the truth that we believe in. "To see is to believe" has no room therefore to those who believe by heart. Thus, when Jesus said to Thomas, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

It is John himself the beloved apostle of Jesus says this truth that Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.
