Shepherd's Thoughts

Shepherd's Thoughts (July 13, 2025) Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Divinely inspired with such simplicity, our first reading reminds us that the words of God are already within us given by Him freely, we just have to look into our hearts and follow. As it is written, "The word is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out" (Dt 30:10-14).

Thus, "Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live" (Ps 69:14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37), as the responsorial Psalm is conveying to us. Turning to God in faith and with humble hearts will surely answer our pleas, for God is great in kindness and His constant help remains forever.

Meanwhile, the second reading portrays to us the fullness of identity of Jesus describing Him both as a savior and maker of this world. It brings to light His divinity in union with God which serves as a call for us to unite ourselves in Him. As it is written, "For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven" (Col 1:15-20).

Moreover, in the Gospel today, Jesus tells us two great things to do to inherit eternal life: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (Lk 10:25-37). All of us are asked to do the same and we will live. Thus, taking care of our neighbors is our duty and responsibility. We live in a corporate and social world where materialism dominates so we are called to treat one another with respect and mercy. Thus, let us call to mind this gift by being always in solidarity with our neighbors especially with the least fortunate.

Coming together as one community of God in this Jubilee Year of Hope, we are reminded again of the beauty of our faith given freely by our Father for us to practice within ourselves, our families and our Church. Let us therefore recognize that loving God consists not just of our prayers but of our concrete actions by loving our neighbors.
