

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time Good is good!

Our human minds cannot fully comprehend God's mercy yet it is woven into the core of our existence. It is said that God's mercy is His justice. God does not contradict Himself. Once He judges, it is His act of mercy. And we all know that God is just. "Should not the judge of all the world act with justice?" (Gn 18:20-32).

The first reading, portraying a dialogue between God and Abraham tells us that even before, we have a Father Whose heart pours out with mercy and love for His children especially to those who are steadfast and faithful to Him. Though evil surrounds us in different forms, God still remains loving and merciful for the sake of the righteous and innocents as He himself said to Abraham in their conversation, "I will spare the whole place for their sake." God in His goodness and kindness will never forsake us.

However, the love of God does not permit us to abuse His mercy. It urges us even more to be faithful and submissive to His divine will. He wants us to be better for the sake of the righteous and not to be worst than the wicked.

The responsorial psalm brings to us the hands of God that is always present in our lives especially when we call upon His name. "Lord, on the day I called for help, you answered me. I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with all my heart, for you have heard the words of my mouth" (Ps 138:1-2, 2-3, 6-7, 7-8). Indeed, it is an imploring prayer, seeking for God's deliverance and protection.

Meanwhile, our second reading puts into words exactly how great God's mercy is for His people through the suffering, death and resurrection of His only begotten Son, Jesus who has given us new life by virtue of our baptism. As it is written, "He brought you to life along with him, having forgiven us all our transgressions" (Col 2:12-14). No matter how unworthy we are in the presence of God, He has always given us the chance to live a life anew as long as we maintain an open heart for Him. In addition, God's justice and mercy will always prevail.

Moreover, the Gospel binds the readings that we have for today with an assurance of blessings, support and compassion coming from Jesus Himself as He has mentioned to His disciples. "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened" (Lk 11:1-13). Such beauty of expression highlighting the distinctive response of God to those who ask, knock and seek in His name.


