

# Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

There is nothing wrong with power, wealth and prominence as long as we put God in its center. It means recognizing His help and grace for everything that we have and acknowledging those who support us.

To accept that we are nothing before God is a genuine act of humanity. Thus, our first reading today teaches us the value of humility in God's eyes and that is what He wants us to acquire in this life for it is written, "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God." (Sir 3:17-18, 20, 28-29).

God generously gives favor to the needy. In fact, our Church has the "preferential option for the poor," a core principle of Catholic social teaching, emphasizing a moral commitment to prioritize the needs of the poor and vulnerable in society. This is precisely what the responsorial Psalm today is telling us, "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor" (Ps. 68:4-5, 6-7, 10-11).

Meanwhile, our second reading re-emphasizes to us the establishment of a new covenant with God for humanity through the bloody sacrifice of Jesus who humbled Himself and took the form of a slave and became obedient until death on the cross for our salvation, as it is written, "And God the judge of all, and the spirits of the just made perfect, and Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and the sprinkled blood that speaks more eloquently than that of Abel." (Heb 12:18-19, 22-24a).

Humility can be shown in various ways: it could be manifested by being submissive to God's divine will, simplicity of lifestyle, lowliness of heart and genuine service to others. Thus, in the Gospel today, Jesus urges us to open our doors to the least fortunate brothers and sisters of ours. He Himself speaks to us, "when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous." (Lk 14:1, 7-14).

The world nowadays seems to feed us with honor, fame and power. While it is a very elating feeling to have all these, we must remember that these are but passing, they will not gain us eternal life. Our Gospel passage focuses on what is truly desired by God for us --- to practice humility. He wanted us to know that our true reward comes from Him and never from this world.

Presented with all these teachings, we are invited to approach the word of God with humble hearts that are seeking to know and get closer to Him by knowing and truly living His ways. And in this Jubilee Year of Hope, let us ask ourselves, what are we seeking and hoping for? The world or God's glory?


