

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time God is good!

God sends His love to us through the people whom we encounter everyday to let us feel His unconditional love and eventually plant the seeds of our faith and let it grow in our lives. In the first reading today, we learn how Elisha became an instrument for Naaman's healing. Full of gratitude, Naaman returned to him and upon his arrival said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel" (2 Kings 5:15). This signifies His profound transformation and his acknowledgment of the uniqueness of Israel's God as the one true God in Israel, following his miraculous healing from leprosy at Elisha's direction. This event foreshadows the inclusion of all nations in God's redemptive plan in the New Testament.

The Lord indeed, because of His love and mercy, has revealed to the nations His saving power. He made all things possible in His mercy and grace as the responsorial Psalm beautifully expresses, "The Lord has made His salvation known: in the sight of the nations He has revealed His justice. He has remembered His kindness and His faithfulness toward the house of Israel. (Ps 98:1, 2-3, 3-4). This reaffirms that God's saving work is not just for His chosen people but is visible and accessible to all.

Meanwhile, in the second reading, Paul connects our death and resurrection with Christ to our future lives emphasizing our perseverance in faith as a condition for reigning with Him on the last Day. Thus, he speaks to us today, "If we have died with Him we shall also live with him; if we persevere we shall also reign with him" (2 Tm 2:11-12).

Naaman's healing in the first reading symbolizes transformation from his being an unbeliever to becoming a faithful follower of the God of Israel. This also connects us to the message of the second reading for today that if we die from our old and sinful ways of life through faith in Christ, we believe that we will also "live with him" to a new life in Christ, a life that is eternal.

With Jesus, transforming our lives through the sacraments, do we also have that longing to sustain this grace that He has offered to us? He has already given us everything necessary for our salvation but how do we cooperate with Him as our Savior?

In our Gospel today, Jesus illustrates to us the importance of gratitude, suggesting that the ungrateful nine were only physically healed, while the one who returned with gratitude were made truly "whole" or "well" by his faith.

How do you live up the words of Jesus in the Gospel today? "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" (Lk 17:17). Can we consider our Sunday Liturgy as our way of coming back and acknowledging God with gratitude for all the graces that we received from Him? Whenever we fail to do it every Sunday, can we consider ourselves one with the nine ungrateful men who, after receiving the gift of healing, just disappeared and remained ungrateful to God?


Our communal act of worship is a concrete manifestation of our profound faith and gradual transformation in persevering to be made whole in Christ again. May this be a constant call for all of us as the Jubilee Year of Hope has reached far enough to the end of 2025 to continue to renew ourselves, full of gratitude to God, stay committed and not feeling obligated to the privileges

that He has been offering to us each time we encounter Him in the the Eucharist.


