

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is Good!

It is with this annual commemoration that together as one family of God we pray for our beloved dead. Have you ever considered at this point in your life that sooner or later you will be with them? If so, have you likewise thought of what you are hoping for once that happens? Surely, each one of us wants to be remembered even after death.

For this reason, we continue to observe this tradition of remembering our beloved dead, in fact, we innovated this practice of posting the names of those who died this past year in a banner. In addition, we list down names of those who passed away many years ago and put them in the "Tumba" symbolizing the tomb or grave to solemnly remember them in our Holy Mass for the whole month of November with the responsory for the dead.

This year's commemoration of all the faithful departed also coincides with our Vocation Awareness Week urging us to continue praying for more vocations to priestly and religious life. This awareness helps us to properly discern to follow Jesus in our chosen way of life and faithfully live it until we finally meet Him in His kingdom where our blessed departed brethren are now enjoying His loving presence.

We hope and pray that we may be comforted as the first reading from the Book of Wisdom is telling us "The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace" (Wis 3:1-9). God gives us an assurance that after a long and well spent life here on earth, He wants us to be with Him in heaven.

The souls are not just in the hands of God but also in His protection and love through the pastoral care of our priests. Being at the bedside of those who are dying, priests remain to be a beacon of hope. They consistently impact people's lives. They lead us to a powerful encounter with God through the sacraments. They are greatly blessed that they are able to perpetuate the saving power of Jesus

Twenty years ago, as a young priest I had a struggle with whether or not I am worthy to carry out Jesus' mission knowing that I was frail too but God's grace filled me and made me able to fulfill my role more than I could ever do myself. He made me an instrument for thousands of infants including adults to become members of this Church. He made me a channel of His forgiveness which He did not give to the angels. He anointed my hands to consecrate the bread and wine to transubstantiate into the Body and Blood of Christ, to bring healing to the sick and He has given me a privilege to lead His people to their resting place.

Called to the different kinds of vocations, be it for priestly or religious or for marriage or single blessedness is a way of life imitating the heart of Jesus, the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. May our responsorial today remind us of our heart's utmost desire, "The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want" (Ps 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6).

Moreover, Paul in his letter to the Romans assures us of God's love if we put our trust in Him. "Hope does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5). In the spirit of hope, we anticipate that moment of genuine, personal and future encounter with the Lord Jesus, who is the "door" (cf. In 10:7, 9) towards eternal life.

Moreover, it is an ultimate truth that we have to proclaim, Jesus is the hope of all the living and the dead. Thus, in the Gospel, Jesus gives us another reason to hope as He Himself speaks to us today, "And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what He gave me, but that I should raise it

on the last day" (Jn 6:39). It is therefore the will of our loving Father that we, who are baptized into Christ, will be with Him on the last day.

Jesus had the right to do His own will, but He chose to obey, and we need to follow His example of perfect surrender. God's will is redemption, not rejection, and the priest mediates to this. We need God to help us receive those even those we do not look forward to seeing that everyone will see God and believe in Him.

Two more months and the Jubilee Year of hope ends but truly, our hope in the love of our Father continues to live. Thus, we must unceasingly pray for each other, especially remembering the souls in purgatory whose pain, anguish and thirst for God are quenched through our sacrifices and constant prayers.
