

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time God is good!

On this Last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church invites us to celebrate Christ as King—the One whose reign is unlike any earthly kingdom. Our first reading recalls the moment when the elders of Israel come to David at Hebron to unite the tribes under his kingship: "King David made an agreement with them before the LORD, and they anointed him king of Israel" (2 Sm 5:3). David's kingship begins with covenant and service, not domination. His authority is rooted in fidelity to God and care for His people.

This spirit of joyful trust flows into our Responsorial Psalm: "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord... for there are set up judgment seats, seats for the house of David." (Ps 121). The throne of David was meant to uphold justice, peace, and gratitude—yet even this earthly throne points to a greater and eternal King.

Saint Paul in the Second Reading affirms that this fulfillment is found in Christ Jesus Himself: "He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son." (Col 1:13). Christ is the image of the invisible God, the One through whom all things were created and reconciled. His kingdom is built not by force, but through forgiveness; not by conquest, but by compassion.

This royal compassion shines most brightly in today's Gospel. Jesus reigns not from a golden throne but from the Cross, offering mercy to the repentant thief who pleads, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." To him Jesus promises, "Today you will be with me in Paradise." (Lk 23:42-43). Here is the heart of our King—One who conquers by love and saves through mercy.

As we honor Christ our King, may His gentle reign shape our lives. May His kingdom of justice, peace, and compassion grow within our hearts, our homes, and our communities.

Reflection Line:

What part of my life needs to surrender more fully to Christ's loving kingship?

Takeaway Thought:

Christ's kingship is rooted in service, not power. Jesus' kingdom grows through mercy, forgiveness, and compassion. And we honor Him best when we allow His love to reign in us.
