

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

As we begin a new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent, the Word of God invites us to lift our eyes, open our hearts, and renew our hope. Advent is not simply a countdown to Christmas—it is a sacred journey of awakening; It is the season when the Lord calls us to move from spiritual sleep to watchful faith, from our daily routine to renewal, from darkness to light.

Isaiah sets the tone beautifully: "Come, let us climb the Lord's mountain... that He may instruct us in His ways, and we may walk in His paths" (Is 2:1–5). The prophet Isaiah envisions a world gathered under God's peace, where swords become plowshares and nations walk together in the light of the Lord. This "climb" symbolizes conversion. The mountain of the Lord is not climbed with our feet but with our hearts—with humility, prayer, and a sincere desire to be taught by God. Advent asks us: Do I still allow the Lord to instruct my ways? Do I desire to walk His paths, especially when they challenge my comfort?

The Responsorial Psalm continues this ascent: "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord" (Ps 122). Jerusalem represents communion, worship, and unity. The joy of the psalmist is the joy of belonging—of being welcomed into the place where God dwells. In a world of conflict, exhaustion, and daily anxieties, the house of the Lord is where we regain our strength and new perspective. Our Mother Church tells us in this Season of Advent, "Come home. Be with our community of faith. And for those who may have already forgotten, step once more into the presence of God and allow Him to restore your joy."

St. Paul then wakes us up with urgency: "Our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed... the night is advanced, the day is at hand" (Rom 13:11–14). Every moment of our lives is moving toward Christ. Time is not an enemy rushing us—it is a gift drawing us closer to the Lord who saves. Paul calls us to "put on Christ," to let His holiness shape our choices. Advent, then, is not passive waiting; it is an active preparation, choosing God's light over darkness, and virtue over complacency.

Finally, in the Gospel Jesus urges us: Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come" (Mt 24:42). The Lord comes in ways we do not expect—through grace disguised in ordinary people, unexpected situations, and quiet invitations to love. To stay awake is to live with spiritual attentiveness, recognizing that Christ is always near. When we are able to do this, we gain a different perspective on how we should treat our neighbors and lead our lives.

As we continue preparing in this Season of Advent and facing the end of the Jubilee year of Hope, let us keep our eyes open towards the ways of Jesus for His coming. Let us spread our light generously until such time we see Jesus face to face. In the meantime, let us acknowledge Jesus' presence in each one of us that we may treat our brothers and sisters with utmost respect and lead a life of active faith.

Reflection Line:

Advent is the climb of the heart—toward God's light, God's peace, God's dwelling place and transforming presence.

Takeaway Thought:

Stay awake in hope—Christ comes daily to hearts that are ready for Him.
