

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is Good!

Whenever we see a Temple or Church we always associate it to God's house where we commonly worship Him and experience His divine presence.

The Church shares a variety of names, for example, Basilica, due to its special privilege granted by the Pope, signifying its importance. These titles are given to Churches that are historically significant, architecturally beautiful, or important centers of worship.

There is also what we call the Cathedral because it serves as the seat of a bishop, the center for the diocese, and a place for grand services and community gatherings. It is also a visible symbol of faith, wealth, and civic pride, and historically functioned as centers of learning, art, and pilgrimage.

Saint John Lateran Basilica is the Pope's Church but most of us Catholics think it is St. Peter's Basilica. The Lateran Church is the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Pope as the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first Basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained as the Church where popes were consecrated.

Now, reflecting on the first reading, Ezekiel describes a vision of a river flowing from the Temple which represents God's life-giving presence and future restoration of Israel after the Babylonian exile. "The angel brought me back to the entrance of the Temple, and I saw water flowing out from beneath the threshold of the Temple" (Ez 47:1).

The vision is likewise seen as a prophecy of living water that represents the Holy Spirit's transforming power to bring life, abundance and healing. The water flowing from the Temple makes the Dead Sea "alive" with fish and vegetation, and the trees along the river's banks bear fruit for food and leaves for healing.

The same message is conveyed to us in our responsorial Psalm today, "The waters of the river gladden the city of God, the holy dwelling of the Most High! (Ps 46:2-3, 5-6, 8-9). This calls us to witness God's creative ways and bring us consolation and awe in His presence.

Meanwhile, in the second reading, Paul, in his First Letter to the Corinthians reminds us that God dwells in us. "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? "(1 Corinthians 3:16). It is often used to emphasize that the presence of God is no longer confined to a physical building like the ancient temple in Jerusalem, but now resides within the spiritual Church, a community of believers.

Today's feast of Dedication of the Lateran Basilica reminds us not only of giving our utmost reverence to the house of God but also to the invisible Church, our community of believers. Jesus Himself was moved with anger because people did not anymore respect the Temple and said "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." He did this because He was passionate about maintaining the purity and purpose of His Father's house" (Jn 2:13-22).

May this also be our act of prayer to always have a caring heart for our place of worship where God dwells. Moreso, let us have enough courage to protect, defend and maintain our rights as caretakers of God's house.
