

### Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

As we enter more deeply into this season of Advent, the Word of God invites us once again to open our hearts to an ancient promise yet ever new: God is coming to save us.

In the First Reading, the prophet Isaiah proclaims a message we all need to hear as we face our own struggles: "Be strong, fear not! Here is your God... He comes to save you" (Is 35:4). These words were spoken to a people burdened and discouraged, longing for restoration, yet they echo powerfully today as many of us and our neighbors experience anxieties, challenges, uncertainties and displacement even in our very own communities. Advent reminds us that God does not remain distant. He comes with strength, healing, and mercy. He comes not to condemn but to lift up, to restore and to save. He never forgets His people.

Meanwhile, our Responsorial Psalm gives voice to this saving action: "The Lord keeps faith forever... secures justice for the oppressed... gives food to the hungry... sets captives free." (Ps 146). God is faithful—always. Even when life feels uncertain, God's work continues quietly and powerfully. Advent invites us to look and see where God is already moving in our lives—opening new doors, offering healing, inspiring generosity, and giving us strength to begin again.

Moreover, in the Second Reading, St. James gives us the posture we need to welcome the Lord: "You too must be patient. Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand" (Jas 5:8). As we are patiently waiting with trust for the Lord's coming, let us remain steadfast even when answers are delayed. Thus, this season of advent, we continue to entrust everything to God so that when He comes, we are ready to receive Him with faith and joy.

Finally, in today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of John the Baptist as the messenger who prepares the way. "Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you;

he will prepare your way before you" (Mt 11:10). John's mission continues in us. Each of us is called to prepare the Lord's way—in our families and in our parish community. We prepare the way when we forgive, when we choose kindness over hatred, when we speak hope over despair, when we make room for God amid our preoccupations and when we consistently honor Him in our daily choices and decisions.

Advent is God's gentle reminder: Do not be afraid—He is coming. Prepare your heart. Let His saving love renew you.

Reflection Line:

Where in my life is God inviting me to let go of fear and welcome His saving presence?

Takeaway Thought:

Advent strengthens our hope—God is coming to save, to heal, and to restore.
