

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

The Lord, speaking through the prophet Zephaniah, reveals His preference for a faithful remnant marked not by might, but by humility and lowliness of heart: "I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly" (Zep 2:3-12). This leads us into the gentle mystery of humility—a strength often unnoticed by the world. God is drawn not to pride or self-importance, but to hearts that trust, surrender, and make room for His grace.

The psalmist emphasizes this message of hope and promise: Blessed are the poor in spirit, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs. The Lord remains faithful forever—securing justice for the oppressed, giving food to the hungry, and, in His mercy, setting captives free (Ps 146:7).

Life, as fragile and finite as it is, continually reminds us that we are not always on top—neither in our careers nor in positions of status. Saint Paul affirms this truth in his First Letter to the Corinthians: "God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong" (1 Cor 1:27). What the world often overlooks or dismisses, God raises up and blesses. This calls us to remain humble despite our worldly accomplishments and acquisitions, for these do not ensure our place in heaven.

In 2009, I was sent by my bishop to a mission station to establish a new parish where everything had to be built from scratch. At times, I felt like a tree planted in parched land, longing for a life-giving stream. When I first arrived, I stayed in a local health and day-care center. Because of this, some people approached me thinking I was the community healthy nurse—or even a male midwife. Others assumed I was the village captain, since the neighboring building served as the community center for meetings and official functions.

There was no bed, no kitchen—nothing but bare walls. I had to provide everything myself. Yet the neighbors welcomed me warmly, offering sleeping mats and sharing their food. In those simple acts of kindness, I felt God's presence and knew I was not alone.

In contrast, when I later arrived in the United States, everything was already provided. For this, I can only say: Thanks be to God. The key point, however, is this: when people are moved by the charity of Christ, they always find something to give and to share. Abundance is not the issue; it is the willingness of the heart to empty itself for a neighbor in need.

I arrived at the mission as a complete stranger, but through the generosity of the people, I slowly found myself at home. What began as a place of scarcity became a dwelling of grace, where God's love took over—revealing that hope often takes root in the humblest beginnings.

Jesus proclaims in the Beatitudes, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:3). Poverty of spirit is not about lacking ambition or joy, but about recognizing our total dependence on God. It is in surrendering ourselves entirely to our Father—not clinging to self-importance—that we discover true freedom and lasting joy.

The Lord assures us, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven" (Mt 5:12). Our hope is not anchored in worldly success, but in God's faithful promise.

Reflection Line:

True greatness in God's eyes is found in humility, trust, and a heart that knows, trusts, and needs Him.

Takeaway Thought:

When we choose humility over pride and trust over self-reliance, we open our lives to the Kingdom that God freely gives.


Diocesan Marriage Retreat
