Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is Good!

This Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost—the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples.

I must admit that whenever I am assigned to a new parish, I often find it challenging because we come from different backgrounds, cultures, experiences, and even speak different languages or dialects. Sometimes you may feel that you do not understand my accent, and at times I feel the same way too. Yet despite these differences, there is something much deeper than language that unites us but the Spirit of God dwelling within us. That is how the Holy Spirit works—uniting differences together to work in harmony for the kingdom of God.

We were created with distinct individuality, making each of us uniquely different. We come from varied cultures blessed with different gifts, and we all walk our own journey in life as we fulfill the mission God has entrusted to us. These differences are not meant to divide us but to complement and enrich one another, revealing the beauty of God's creation. In the first reading we hear: "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues" (Acts 2:4). The Holy Spirit did not erase their differences; rather, He transformed them into instruments of unity and understanding.

Our Responsorial Psalm becomes our prayer today: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth" (Ps 104:30). We need the Holy Spirit because human efforts alone can sometimes lead to misunderstanding, division, pride, and fear. The Spirit renews hearts, restores relationships, and helps us see one another not as strangers, but as brothers and sisters in Christ.

Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading: "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body" (1 Cor 12:13). Though we have different gifts, responsibilities, and ways of serving, we belong to one Body—the Body of Christ. The Church is like a family where every person has a purpose, every gift matters, and every member is important.

In the Gospel, Jesus entrusts His disciples with a mission and gives them courage: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And after saying this, "He breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit'" (Jn 20:21–22). The same Spirit that strengthened the disciples thousands of years ago is the same Spirit shared with us today helping us to fulfill our mission as well.

Pentecost also reminds us that the frightened disciples hiding behind locked doors were transformed by the Holy Spirit into courageous witnesses of Christ. In the same way, the Spirit desires to transform us—to turn our fears into courage, our doubts into faith, our divisions into communion, and our hearts into channels of God's love.

As we celebrate Pentecost, let us open our hearts and pray: "Come, Holy Spirit." May He renew our faith, strengthen our hope, and teach us to love as one family united in Christ so that through our lives others may encounter His presence.



Reflection Line:

Pentecost reminds us that God does not erase our differences; rather, He transforms them into gifts that build unity and strengthen the Church.

Takeaway Thought:

When the Holy Spirit fills our hearts, differences no longer divide us; they become opportunities to reveal God's love and bring others closer to Christ.
