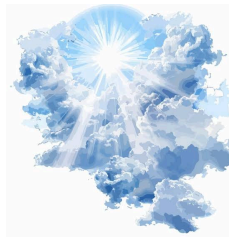

Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

In our first reading, God reminds His people of their special calling: "You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Ex 19:6a). These words were first spoken to Israel, but through Baptism they are also addressed to us. God has chosen us not only to belong to Him but also to reflect His holiness, goodness, and love in the world. Through Baptism, we share in the priesthood of Christ by offering our prayers, sacrifices, and daily lives as witnesses to His presence through our words, actions, thoughts, and choices.

The Responsorial Psalm echoes this identity: "We are his people: the sheep of his flock" (Ps 100:3). We belong to God, our Good Shepherd. He knows us, cares for us, and provides us with the graces we need for our salvation. In a world where many feel lost, burdened, or forgotten, these words remind us that we are always held in His loving care. Even when we do not fully understand what God is doing in our lives, we are called to trust Him with confidence.

Saint Paul deepens this message in the second reading: "God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). God did not wait for us to become worthy of His love. He loved us first. Through Christ's sacrifice on the Cross, God revealed the depth of His mercy and compassion. His love continually seeks us, forgives us, and invites us into eternal life. While His mercy is freely given, He also calls us to respond with faith, conversion, and a sincere desire to follow Him.

This same compassion is revealed in the Gospel. As Jesus looked upon the crowds, "His heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd" (Mt 9:36). Jesus saw beyond the faces in the crowd. He saw their wounds, fears, struggles, and deepest needs.

The Lord continues to look upon us with that same loving gaze today. He sees those who are lonely, grieving, discouraged, searching for meaning, and longing for hope. He knows the burdens we carry and the crosses we bear. His compassion is never distant. It is personal, healing, and life-giving.

Because of this compassion, Jesus says: "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few" (Mt 9:37). The Lord continues to call laborers into His harvest—not only priests, deacons, and religious, but every baptized Christian. We are all sent to share His love, encourage the discouraged, strengthen the weak, and lead others closer to Christ through our example and service. In all that we do, we must point others not to ourselves but to Jesus, whose mercy reaches every human heart.

Finally, Jesus reminds His disciples: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8). Everything we have—our faith, talents, blessings, and God's mercy—is a gift. As disciples, we are called to share these gifts generously for the glory of God and the good of others. The more we give in love, the more we become instruments of His compassion in the world.

As we celebrate this Eucharist, let us thank God for calling us to be His people and for loving us even in our weaknesses. May His compassion fill our hearts and make us faithful laborers in His harvest, generously sharing the gifts we have received.

Reflection Line:

Jesus sees beyond our outward appearance and looks into our hearts with love and compassion. He invites us to see others as He does—not with judgment, but with mercy, understanding, and care. Am I a channel of God's grace, or do I wound my own soul and the souls of others through uncharitable thoughts, words, and actions?

Takeaway Thought:

The heart of Jesus is moved with compassion; may my heart be moved to serve and follow Him faithfully.
