 **Shepherd's Thoughts**

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

Kindness springs forth joy and life. If you were to ask me what trait I desire most, I would simply say: I want to be kind, for kindness is one of the foundations of holiness. The word itself comes from "kin," reminding us to treat others as our own, doing good without expecting anything in return. Indeed, kindness is one of the greatest gifts we can offer our neighbors who, like us, are created in the image and likeness of God.

This simple yet profound act of kindness is beautifully illustrated in our first reading. The generous couple warmly welcomed the prophet Elisha and treated him as one of their own. Recognizing that "Elisha is a holy man of God" (2 Kgs 4:9), they prepared a small room for him with a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp (2 Kgs 4:10). Their gesture was not extravagant, but it was sincere and selfless. They remind us that every act of hospitality and generosity becomes a place where God Himself is welcomed and encountered.

Because of such goodness, the Psalmist can joyfully proclaim, "For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord" (Ps 89:2). Indeed, whenever we choose kindness, we become living witnesses to God's goodness in our world, drawing people near to Him.

Saint Paul, in the second reading, reminds us that through Baptism we have been united with Christ so that, "just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Rom 6:4). This new life in Christ is not simply a change of habits but a transformation of the heart—a life marked by compassion, generosity, forgiveness, and kindness.

Yet kindness, especially nowadays, is not always easy. It is often tested by pain, misunderstandings, sacrifices, and the crosses we carry each day. That is why Jesus says, "Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me" (Mt 10:38). True kindness often requires sacrifice. It calls us to choose patience over anger, forgiveness over resentment, and love over selfishness.


Certainly, loving and being faithful to our parents and our loved ones are just a few of the kindest things we can do. But Jesus also reminds us that the highest form of love and kindness is to place God above everything else and to remain faithful to Him, even when it demands sacrifice, for "whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Mt 10:39).


The Lord further teaches us that every act of welcome and goodness offered to others is ultimately offered to Him: "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me" (Mt 10:40). In every person we meet, especially those who are poor, lonely, or in need, we are given the opportunity to receive Christ Himself.

Finally, Jesus assures us that even the smallest act of charity is precious in God's eyes. A cup of cold water given to one of His little ones will never go unrewarded (Mt 10:42). No act of kindness is ever wasted. Every good deed, no matter how hidden or simple, leaves a lasting mark on another person's life and becomes a beautiful offering to God.
