## Shepherd's Thoughts

*God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!*

Today, the Church joyfully celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—Corpus Christi. We give thanks for the priceless gift of the Holy Eucharist, the very Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. As mystical as it may sound, the Eucharist is the heart of our Catholic faith and the greatest treasure entrusted to the Church.

The Second Vatican Council beautifully teaches in Sacrosanctum Concilium that the Eucharist is “the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed and the source from which all her power flows” (SC 10). Everything we do as a Church finds its meaning and strength in Christ present in the Eucharist. It is here that we are nourished, strengthened, and united as one family of faith.

Many of us may ask why God has allowed for the Eucharist to take form in a bread, the answer is simple, He wants it to be ingrained in something that is very familiar in our lives, an essential part of our daily existence. That is what He longs for us to do with His Son Jesus --- to make Him a part of us consistently.

In the first reading, Moses reminds the people of Israel how God lovingly cared for them during their journey through the desert: “He fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers.” This heavenly bread sustained them physically, but it also taught them a deeper lesson: “Not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord” (Dt 8:3). God was preparing His people for an even greater gift—the true Bread from Heaven, Jesus Christ Himself.

With grateful hearts, we join the psalmist in proclaiming: “Praise the Lord, Jerusalem” (Ps 147:12). We praise God because He continues to feed His people, not with manna that passes away, but with the Bread of Life that endures forever: Every Eucharist is a reminder of God’s abiding and faithful love for His children.

Saint Paul, in the second reading, emphasizes the unity that flows from the Eucharist: “The loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body” (1 Cor 10:17). We are united through our participation in the one Bread and the one Cup that sustains us all. The Eucharist not only nourishes our relationship with Christ but also strengthens our communion with one another.

In the Gospel, Jesus reveals the profound mystery of the Eucharist: “I am the living bread that came down from heaven” (Jn 6:51). He speaks words that challenge human understanding but reveal the depth of His love: “For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink” (Jn 6:55). Jesus does not merely give us something; He gives us Himself. In every Holy Communion, we receive His real presence—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Finally, Jesus offers us a promise filled with hope: “Whoever eats this bread will live forever” (Jn 6:58). The Eucharist is food for our earthly pilgrimage and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet prepared for us in eternal life. It

strengthens us in moments of weakness, comforts us in times of sorrow, and continually reminds us that we are never alone.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi, may we renew our love and reverence for the Holy Eucharist. Let us approach the altar with faith, gratitude, and humility, recognizing that here, Christ gives Himself completely for our salvation. May the Eucharist continue to nourish our souls, deepen our unity, and lead us closer to the Lord Who remains with us always.



Reflection Line:

The Eucharist is not simply a gift from Jesus—it is Jesus Himself, given for the life of the world.

Takeaway Thought:

The more we receive Christ in the Eucharist with faith and devotion, the more we become what we receive—the living Body of Christ in the world to be shared for God’s greater glory.

# ***BREAKING BREAD***

## **A new Missal and Hymn Book**

Beginning next weekend (June 13-14) we will no longer use the Seasonal Missalettes or the Spirit and Song hymn book. We will begin using **Breaking Bread**, a book that is also used by several of the parishes in our area.

Breaking Bread is a year-long book that runs from Advent to Advent. The books will be put in the pews when Advent starts and remain there for the entire year until the next Advent.

Breaking Bread contains the weekend Scripture readings that we are used to seeing in the Seasonal Missalettes. Breaking Bread also has many of the familiar hymns that were in the Missalettes and in the Spirit and Song books, along with some hymns we have not had access to in the past.

Breaking Bread also has additional prayers we can use for communal prayer or during quiet reflection and meditation. Prayers can be found on the inside of the front and back covers and on pages 325-337.

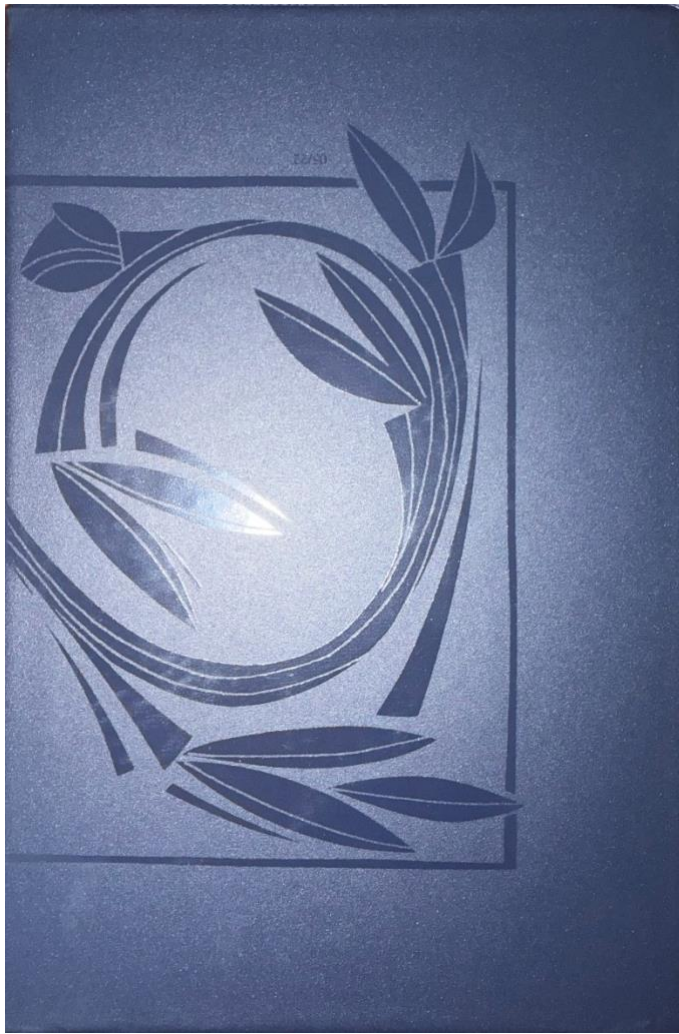
While these new books do have some information for daily Masses, we will continue to have the WORD AMONG US available for those who attend daily Mass. The WORD AMONG US includes the scripture readings for each day that are not available in Breaking Bread.

We ask for your help in two things:

- The books are to remain in the pews and not be taken home; cost prohibits us from ordering copies for each parishioner
- The only two items that will be in the book racks in the pews are (1) Breaking Bread and (2) the laminated prayer card; no additional prayer cards or literature will be in the book rack
