Shepherd's Thoughts

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

If God were to appear to you today and say, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you" (1 Kgs 3:5), what would you ask for?

The majority might ask for good health, financial security, success, or peace for our families. Yet, when God asked King Solomon this very question, he did not ask for riches, power, or a long life. Instead, he prayed, "Give your servant an understanding heart" (1 Kgs 3:9). Because Solomon desired wisdom above everything else, God blessed him with "a heart so wise and understanding" (1 Kgs 3:12).

The Psalm reminds us why Solomon made such a choice: "Lord, I love your commands" (Ps 119:97). God's wisdom is more valuable than wealth because "the law of your mouth is to me more precious than thousands of gold and silver pieces" (Ps 119:72). A heart formed by God's Word knows what truly matters.

Saint Paul reminds us that "we are called according to his purpose" (Rom 8:28). God desires not only to bless us but to transform us, "for those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son" (Rom 8:29). True happiness is found not in possessing more, but in becoming more like Christ.

That is the heart of today's Gospel. Jesus compares the Kingdom of Heaven to a treasure hidden in a field, a pearl of great price, and a net cast into the sea (Mt 13:44-49). The treasure and the pearl remind us that a relationship with God is worth more than anything else. Those who discover Him willingly let go of everything that keeps them from following Him. The net reminds us that one day we will stand before God, and what will matter most is whether we chose His Kingdom above all else.

Every day, we make choices. We choose how to spend our time, what we value, and whom we follow. Today's readings invite us to ask not simply for more blessings, but for the wisdom to recognize the greatest treasure we already possess—Jesus Christ. When we choose Him first, everything else finds its proper place. When we rest in God, our hearts find peace in the midst of noise.



Reflection Line:

The wisest heart is the one that treasures Christ above everything else.



Takeaway Thought:

If God asked you today, "What do you want me to give you?" may your answer be: "Lord, give me a wise and understanding heart that always chooses You."
