Shepherd's Thoughts

Today's readings invite us to slow down, listen to God's voice, trust Him in life's storms, and become instruments of His love.

The Lord told Elijah, "Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by" (1 Kgs 19:11). Elijah expected God to appear in the wind, the earthquake, or the fire. Instead, "there was a tiny whispering sound" (1 Kgs 19:13). God often comes quietly. He speaks in prayer, in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in the ordinary moments of our lives. He reveals His presence in countless ways—if only we open our hearts to Him.

The Psalm reminds us of the response God desires: "I will hear what God proclaims. Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation" (Ps 85:8–9). Before asking God to hear us, we are first invited to stop, look, and listen to Him.

A heart that listens to God is transformed. That is why Saint Paul could say, "I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people" (Rom 9:3). His deep love for God became a selfless love for others. The closer we grow to Christ, the more we learn to care, forgive, and sacrifice for the sake of His Kingdom.

The Gospel shows us where that transformation begins. Jesus "went up on the mountain by Himself to pray" (Mt 14:23). Strengthened by prayer, He came to His disciples in the midst of the storm and said, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid" (Mt 14:27). Peter stepped out in faith, but when he focused on the wind instead of on Jesus, he began to sink and cried, "Lord, save me!" (Mt 14:30). Immediately, Jesus reached out His hand. Even His words, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Mt 14:31), were not a rebuke but a loving invitation to trust Him more deeply.

My dear brothers and sisters, we all experience storms in life. Often, we cling to the safety of our own boats—our comfort, plans, security, and possessions. Our self-reliance can keep us from hearing Jesus' invitation to step out in faith and fix our eyes on Him. Yet the same Lord who spoke to Elijah in the silence, transformed Paul's heart with love, and reached out His hand to Peter walks with us today. He continues to whisper, strengthen, and save.

As we celebrate this Holy Mass, may we learn to listen to God's gentle voice, trust Him in every storm, and reflect His love in our daily lives.

God's gentle whisper gives us the courage to trust Him, and His grace enables us to become His compassionate presence for others.



Takeaway Thought:

This week, spend a few quiet moments with the Lord each day. Listen to His voice, keep your eyes fixed on Christ, and let His love guide every step you take.
