

Shepherd's Thoughts

FIRST READING (Mal 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10)

You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Ps 131:1, 2, 3)

In you, Lord, I have found my peace.

SECOND READING (1 Thes 2:7b-9, 13)

We were determined to share with you not only the Gospel of God, but our very selves as well.

GOSPELMt 23:1-12

They preach but they do not practice.

God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

Action speaks louder than words". This simple yet striking maxim can be traced back to 1 John 3:18, "Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth". Your actions will speak much louder than any words you will ever say."

Jesus himself is telling us the same message in the Gospel today. Based on his observations, Scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. As a sort of advice to the crowd and his disciples, He said, "Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice." There is always, in fact, a resistance in understanding a person talking much without an act of doing.

It is for this reason why Jesus reprimanded the Scribes and Pharisees for "they tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen." Those are just externalities to gain praise from the people. Not only that, they also "love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi." Sometimes, we have that same attitude. We always want to be the center of attraction and be the best among the rest. We love to be praised by others. Yes, it's true that sometimes, we also need affirmations but always remember, Jesus wants us to be humble all the time.

To all the parents who are all present here, the message of Jesus is still very much relevant to this present generation. You need not to talk much and be the big boss all the time like those of the Scribes and Pharisees. If you really want to teach your children just be yourself and set as good examples and they will surely obey and understand what you are trying to inculcate to them.

What is important now, as Christians, is to model our lives to Jesus. He does not only teach us with his inspiring words but he also serves as a good example. He is that big God from above in our sight but He humbles himself and remains to be a servant of all. "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."
