

## Shepherd's Thoughts

FIRST READING (Is 45:1, 4-6)

I have grasped the right hand of Cyrus to subdue the nations before you. *RESPONSORIAL PSALM* (Ps 96:1, 3, 4-5, 7-8, 9-10)

Give the Lord glory and honor.

SECOND READING (1 Thes 1:1-5b)

Calling to mind faith, love, and hope.

GOSPEL (Mt 22:15-21)

Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.

## God is Good, all the time! All the time, God is good!

No doubt, Jesus is a good teacher. He teaches us with the Gospel today not only to become law abiding citizens but also to be responsible sons and daughters of God. If we can afford to pay taxes to the government, by all means we should also learn how to share our time, talents and treasures to God for he became so generous to us in the first place. Without cost he gave us everything he even offered his own life for the salvation of all.

Indeed, we cannot fully grasp the mind of Jesus while conversing with the emissaries who asked him, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" His human way of telling his opinion already speaks of his divine wisdom. Thus he immediately said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites?. "Show me the coin that pays the census tax."... He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." And with courage he answered,"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." These words of Jesus " might have been stimulating controversies with the various kinds of Jewish leaders—Pharisees, Herodians and Sadducees for which they would surely think of a violent rebellion against him. Perhaps, with the same maxim of Jesus, our government started to develop the idea of collecting taxes from the people based on this biblical text that is why we have been paying estate and federal taxes and began to establish the idea of separation between church and state.

Bishop Ricken is encouraging us this World Mission Sunday, October 21-22, to heed the call of the Holy Father by praying, preaching on and promoting this Sunday's annual collection for the missionary Church. This is not our tax, this is not for Caesar, but a way of giving back what is due to God. This is the annual collection from here in the United States and through the Diocese we directly give it to the beneficiaries. Cardinal Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, encourages us to give generously from the heart and urges us with the Holy Father's theme for this year: "hearts on fire, feet on the move", inspired by the disciple's journey to Emmaus.

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Corinthians 9:6-8)

We are a synodal church modeled after the heart of Jesus who attends for the needy and cares for the lowly. Whatever we do to the least brothers of ours we do that to God.
