



Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Columbarium?

A columbarium is a structure that entombs the cremated remains of the departed.

Does the Church permit cremation?

The Catholic Church does permit cremation with the provision that the remains be properly interred.

If we choose cremation can we still have a Funeral Mass?

Yes. One option is to have the cremation done after the funeral Mass.

Who will maintain the columbarium?

Sacred Heart Catholic Church will be responsible for maintenance of the columbarium.

Can flowers or memorials be left for loved ones?

No memorial decorative objects, including live or artificial plants or flowers, shall be placed in the Columbarium area.

Will there be any restrictions on who can be interred in our columbarium?

The Sacred Heart Columbarium is intended for the deceased members of Sacred Heart Parish and their family members (who may be non-Catholic).

Will the Church provide an urn?

Yes, urns of the proper size are part of the purchase contract.

How many urns can be interred in one niche?

Each niche is designed to accommodate two urns.

Can ashes be combined in one urn?


No. The mingling of cremated remains is not an accepted practice.

What is the cost of a niche?


The cost of the niche, which accommodates two urns, is \$1,700. Cost includes 2 urns and the engraved name plate. The cost for a single niche, which includes 1 urn and engraved name plate, is \$1,500. A shared option available upon request.

What payment methods are available?

Cash, check or money order.



Each columbarium is a two-sided structure with 40 niches on each side for a total of 160 niches.
