3. How We Use Your Information

We use the information we collect to:

- Manage billing
- Maintain medical records
- Improve our website and services
- Comply with legal obligations

4. Legal Basis for Use and Disclosure

Under HIPAA, we may use or disclose your PHI for treatment, payment, or healthcare operations without your written authorization. We also disclose your case-specific information under court order. All other uses or releases require your consent.

5. How We Share Your Information

We may share your information with:

- Legal authorities when required by law (e.g., reporting abuse, court orders)
- Emergency services if there is an imminent risk of harm

We do not sell or rent your personal or health information.

6. How We Protect Your Information

We implement administrative, technical, and physical safeguards to protect your data, including:

- Encrypted data storage
- Limited access to health records
- Staff training on privacy practices

7. Your Rights

You have the right to:

- Access your records
- Request corrections
- Receive an accounting of disclosures
- Request restrictions on how your information is used
- Withdraw consent (where applicable)
- File a complaint with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) if you believe your privacy rights have been violated
