4th Sunday of Easter: The Church Is the Door

“Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.” (Jn 10:1-3)

WORD OF LIFE

Can you imagine a Christian in love with the Lord's message, but who cannot put up with Him? Can you imagine a Franciscan Friar excited about Saint Francis' message of simplicity and poverty, but who does not accept him? It would be nonsense and a contradiction. Every spiritual and material house has a door. If you are not a thief or a robber, but the one who lives there, you would enter through the door. Christ is the door of Christianity, and we cannot be Christians without loving Him and wishing to follow and worship Him.

Theoretically speaking, everyone agrees with this. But, in practice, many build a tailor-made Christ for themselves. Sometimes, encouraged by some theologians or priests who are not in communion with the Church. They pick and choose and even suppress what they do not like of Christ's message with the oft-used excuse that maybe that was not what the Lord said, or that it was a later addition, the result of the interests of the Roman Popes to have power, or other such things.

For those who are always faithful to Christ and His Church, like Mary and Saint Francis, following the Lord is not only entering through His door, that is, His teachings, but also entering through the door of the Church, which helps us to discern the Will of God. We should not forget that the Church is the Mystical Body of Christ and that, without the Church, we cannot be with Christ.

Purpose: Through prayer, start having a personal relationship with the Lord, who is your Shepherd. And whenever you have doubts about some moral norm, accept what the Church teaches.

IV Domingo de Pascua: La Iglesia es la puerta

PALABRA DE VIDA

¿Se imaginan a un cristiano enamorado del mensaje del Señor, pero que no soportara a Cristo? ¿Se imaginan a un franciscano entusiasmado con el mensaje de sencillez y pobreza del santo de Asís, pero que no aceptara a San Francisco? Sería un absurdo, un contrasentido. Cada casa espiritual, lo mismo que cada casa material, tiene una puerta y si se es de la casa y no un ladrón o bandido, hay que pasar por ella. Cristo es la puerta del cristianismo y no se puede ser cristiano sin amar a Cristo, desear seguir a Cristo, adorar a Cristo.

Teóricamente todos están de acuerdo con esto. Sin embargo, en la práctica, muchos se construyen un Cristo a su medida. Ayudados a veces por algunos teólogos que no están en comunión con la Iglesia o por algunos sacerdotes, seleccionan y suprimen del mensaje de Cristo lo que no les gusta, con la excusa tan repetida en estos tiempos de que quizá eso no lo dijo el Señor sino que es posible que fuera una adherencia posterior, fruto de los intereses de los Papas de Roma por mandar, o cosas así que tan a la ligera se dicen.

Para nosotros, siempre fieles a Cristo y a su Iglesia, como María, como San Francisco, seguir al Señor es no sólo pasar por la puerta de Él como Maestro, sino también por la puerta de la Iglesia, que es la que en cada momento concreto de la historia nos ayuda a discernir lo que quiere Dios. No hay que olvidar que la Iglesia es el Cuerpo Místico de Cristo y que no se puede estar con Cristo sin estar con la Iglesia.

Propósito: Ten una relación personal con el Señor, que es tu pastor, mediante la oración. Y cuando tengas dudas acerca de alguna norma moral, acepta lo que dice la Iglesia.

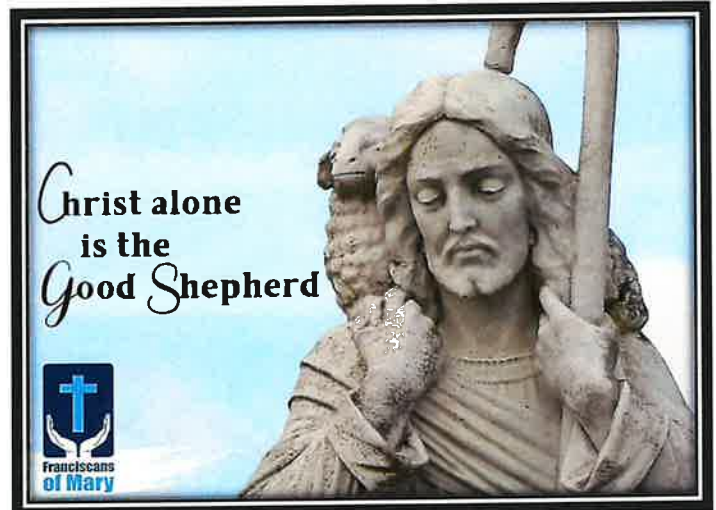

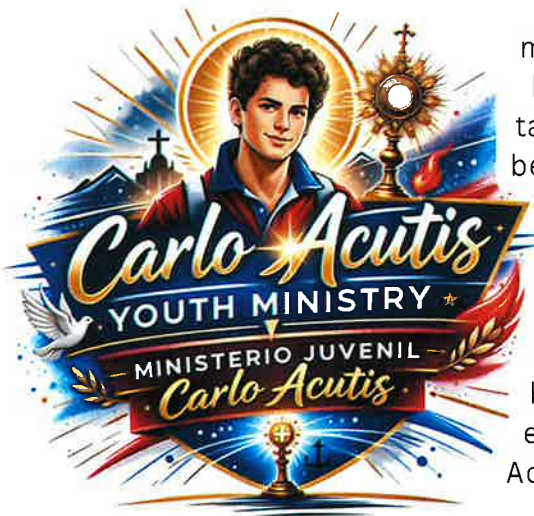

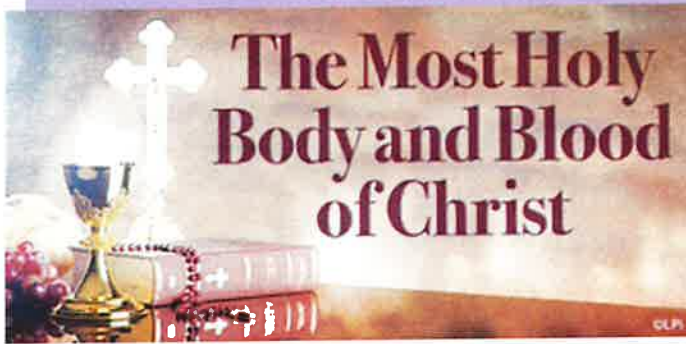

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida.

Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices **Amén**. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

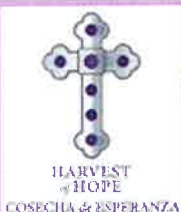

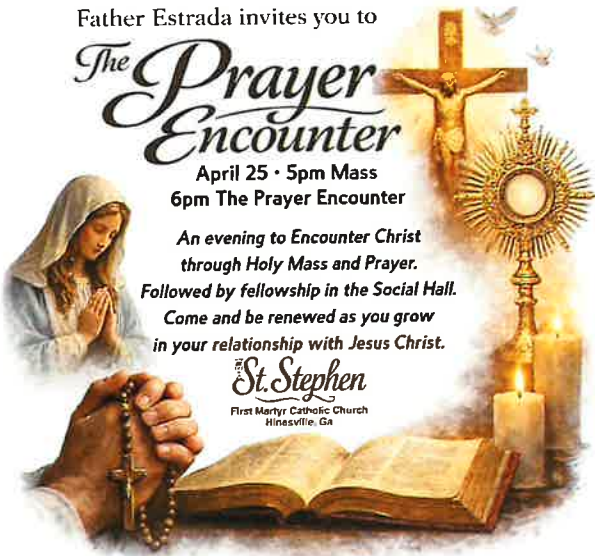

Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1st – 8th grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.

Parish Office is Open Monday 9a-6p and Tuesday-Thursday 9a-2p
