“Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.” (Mt 5 :4)

WORD OF LIFE

The account of the Beatitudes is considered the moral project of Christianity. Although it is summed up in a single commandment, just as Christ taught at the Last Supper, the commandment of love is a new and original kind of commandment. It is no longer a matter of not doing evil, but, above all, of doing good. And to do good, we must be generous with our money, which makes us a little poorer as it makes those we help a little less poor. To do good, we must fulfill our obligations, even if this entails shedding some tears. To do good, we must defend the cause of justice, and as a result, be on the side of those who suffer injustices, even if we are included among those who are persecuted for doing so. To do good, we must work for peace by eliminating tension from violent situations, even though this might make life difficult for us, and we run the risk of being attacked by the parties in conflict. To do good, we must forgive even if it is not reciprocated.

We must try to practice all the Beatitudes, but at least, we should begin with one, the one that is easiest for us to practice, and become a specialist in it. But we must not ignore the rest. We must strive to be peaceful, generous, humble, chaste, and honest. Then, we will be happy, as Christ promises.

Purpose: Choose the virtue that is easiest for you to practice. Live it to the fullest. Become a specialist in it. And then, choose another one.

PALABRA DE VIDA

El relato de las bienaventuranzas es considerado como el proyecto moral del cristianismo. Aunque éste se resume en un único mandamiento, tal y como enseñó Cristo en la Última Cena, el mandamiento del amor, se desglosa en un nuevo y original tipo de mandamientos. Ya no se trata de no hacer el mal, sino sobre todo de hacer el bien. Y para hacer el bien tenemos que ser generosos con nuestro dinero, lo cual nos hace un poco más pobres a la par que hace a los que ayudamos un poco menos pobres. Para hacer el bien tenemos que cumplir con nuestras obligaciones, aunque eso nos suponga derramar alguna lágrima. Para hacer el bien tenemos que defender la causa de la justicia y, como consecuencia, estar al lado de los que sufren las injusticias, aunque nos incluyan a nosotros entre los perseguidos. Para hacer el bien debemos trabajar por la paz, quitando hierro a las situaciones de violencia, aunque eso nos complique la vida y corramos el riesgo de que nos ataquen las dos partes en conflicto. Para hacer el bien tenemos que perdonar, incluso aunque no recibamos de la otra parte un trato semejante.

Hay que intentar practicar todas las bienaventuranzas, pero, al menos, convendría por empezar por una – por la que sea más fácil para uno mismo- y especializarse en ella, sin que eso suponga olvidar las demás. Sé pacífico. Sé generoso. Sé humilde. Sé prudente. Sé casto. Sé honrado. Y serás feliz, como promete Cristo.

Propósito: Elige la virtud que te resulte más sencilla. Vívela a fondo. Conviértete en un especialista de ella. Y luego ve a por otra.

CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



Devotion to the Sacred Heart has developed over the centuries following the experiences of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the apparitions she witnessed in the seventeenth century. Popes have lauded the practice of consecration of the self, home, and even whole nations to the Sacred Heart.¹ In his encyclical instituting the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI, drawing on the teaching of Pope Leo XIII, commended the “pious custom” of consecrating the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way to recognize the kingship of Christ.

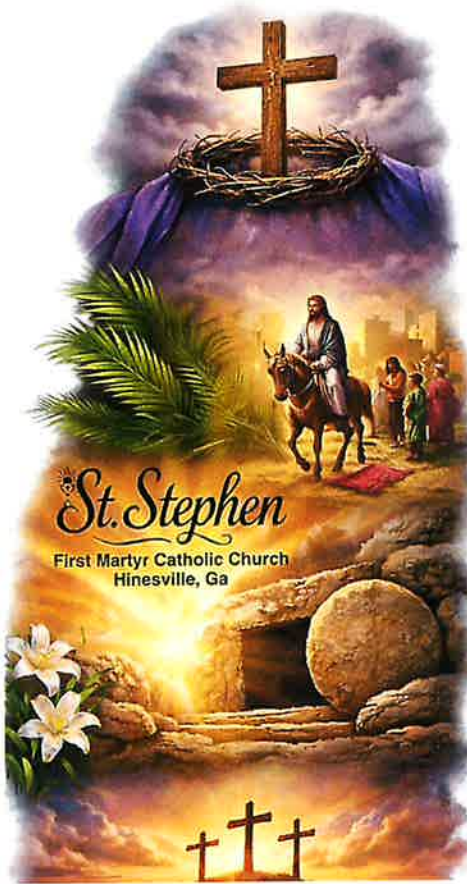

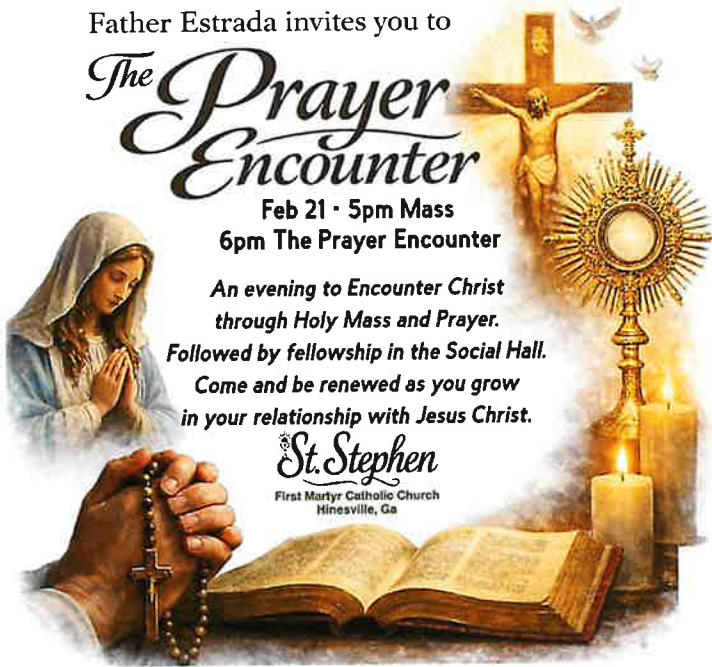

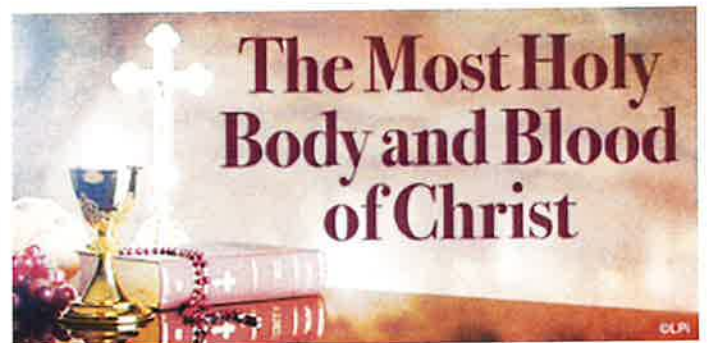

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
