

6th Sunday in OT: It Is Not Enough to Not Be Bad

“I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven.” (Mt 5:20)

WORD OF LIFE

The term Pharisee is so discredited that it is difficult for us to understand what Jesus meant when He made that comparison and invited His disciples to be better than them. Actually, at that time, the Pharisees were the most religious, observant, and faithful defenders of God. If we were to seek an equivalent in today’s terms, we might say they were “people who go to Mass daily.” This comparison is not fair and is even offensive, but it helps us to understand that the apostles were being invited to become the best of the best of the Jews. But, best at what?

Of course, it was not about being more meticulous and demanding in liturgical or ritual matters, such as rest on the Sabbath, culinary rules, temple taxes, etc. What Jesus wanted was to release the heart of the good Jew, of the Pharisee, from the limitation that kept it bound. Of course, this could only be understood by the apostles at the end of Christ’s life (when, at the Last Supper, He gave them a new commandment) and, above all, after the coming of the Holy Spirit. But even then, they were able to understand only something of what the Lord wanted to teach them. For Jesus, it was not a matter of being content with not doing evil or of fulfilling the law. What He asked of His disciples was to go further: to do as much good as possible and not to be satisfied until they had helped their neighbor as much as they could. Christ did not ask then, nor does He ask now, for the impossible; He simply asks us to love. And love begins by not doing evil and continues by doing good, as Christ did.

Purpose: Do not be content with not doing evil. Examine your conscience on the sins of omission, on the good you could have done and which you left undone for whatever reason.

VI Domingo del TO: No basta con no ser malo

“Os lo aseguro: Si no sois mejores que los escribas y fariseos, no entraréis en el Reino de los Cielos” (Mt5,20)

PALABRA DE VIDA

El término “fariseo” está tan desprestigiado que nos resulta difícil comprender lo que quería decir Jesús cuando ponía esa comparación e invitaba a sus discípulos a ser mejores que ellos. En realidad, en aquella época los fariseos eran los más religiosos, observantes y fieles defensores de Dios. Si tuviéramos que buscar un equivalente, diríamos que eran los de “misa diaria”; esta comparación no es justa e incluso es ofensiva en sí misma, pero nos sirve para entender que los apóstoles estaban siendo invitados a ser mejores que los mejores de los judíos. Pero ¿mejores en qué?

Desde luego, no se trataba de ser más puntilloso y exigente en cuestiones litúrgicas o en asuntos rituales (descanso del sábado, reglas culinarias, impuestos al templo, etc.). Lo que Jesús quería era que se superara por arriba la limitación que mantenía encorsetado el corazón del buen judío, del fariseo. Ciertamente, esto sólo lo pudieron entender bien los apóstoles al final de la vida de Cristo (cuando, en la Última Cena, les da el mandamiento nuevo) y, sobre todo, después de la venida del Espíritu Santo. Pero ya entonces pudieron comprender algo de lo que el Señor quería enseñarles. Para Jesús, no se trataba de quedarse contento con no hacer el mal o con cumplir las leyes; lo que Él pedía a sus seguidores era que fueran más allá, que hicieran todo el bien posible, que no se quedaran satisfechos hasta que no hubieran ayudado al prójimo con todas sus fuerzas. Cristo no pedía ni pide imposibles; pide, simplemente, que amemos. Y amar empieza por no hacer el mal y sigue por hacer el bien. Como él hizo.

Propósito: No te conformes con no hacer el mal. Examina tu conciencia sobre los pecados de omisión, sobre el bien que podías haber hecho y que por comodidad has dejado de hacer.



Holy Thursday Mass will be at 6p.


Good Friday 2p Stations of the Cross and 3p Celebration of the Passion of the Lord.





Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1st – 8th grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
