## 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent: Seek the Living Water

---

*“If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.” (Jn 4:10)*

---

### WORD OF LIFE

This Sunday’s Gospel tells us about Jesus’ encounter with the Samaritan woman. The Lord took advantage of this event to teach His disciples and us a lesson. The Lord tells us to ‘seek the living water.’ Look for the water that satisfies thirst, the water of inner happiness, which is so different from what the world offers. Although it may be fulfilling for a while, it soon leaves our palate craving for more.

In order to seek the type of water that God offers to us, we need only to become aware that it is truly the best and that we are indeed interested in being close to Je-sus, because only by remaining close to Him will we be happy, no matter the cost.

Only Christ has the water that quenches our thirst for happiness. All others are just imitations, or at best, partial accomplishments. If we are aware and convinced of this, whatever price we have to pay to attain this precious treasure will not matter.

As we learned last week, to attain this precious treasure, we should remember those moments in our lives when we felt happy precisely because we were close to God and had inner peace. We should also remember the other moments in which things went wrong because we had turned away from the Lord. Or if, perchance, this did not happen to us because we did not distance ourselves from the Lord as did others, then let’s give thanks to God for being our protector and source of our happiness.

**Purpose:** Make an examination of conscience to discover what you are doing wrong and from what wells of “unquenching water” you are drinking. Then, go to confession. Give thanks to God because without Him you will not be happy.

## III Domingo de Cuaresma: Buscar el agua viva

---

*“Jesús le contestó: ‘Si conocieras el don de Dios y quién es el que te pide de beber, le pedirías tú, y él te daría agua viva’” (Jn 4, 10)*

---

### PALABRA DE VIDA

El Evangelio de esta semana nos narra el episodio del encuentro de Jesús con la samaritana. El Señor aprovechó aquel momento para dar una lección a sus discípulos y, a través de ellos, a todos nosotros: busca el agua viva, nos dice el Maestro. Busca el agua que sacia la sed, el agua de la felicidad interior, tan distinta a esa otra que ofrece el mundo y que puede ser muy satisfactoria en algún momento pero al poco tiempo te deja el paladar estragado.

Para buscar ese tipo de agua que Dios nos ofrece sólo necesitamos una cosa: darnos cuenta de que de verdad es la mejor, de que nos interesa estar junto a Jesús porque sólo junto a Él vamos a ser felices, por más que eso tenga un precio y nos suponga renunciar a otras cosas. El agua viva, el agua que sacia la sed de felicidad, sólo la tiene Cristo. Lo demás son imitaciones o, como mucho, realizaciones parciales. Sabiendo esto, estando convencidos de ello, no nos importará pagar el precio que sea para lograr ese preciado tesoro.

Para conseguirlo, continuando con el propósito de la semana anterior, debemos recordar aquellos momentos de nuestra vida en los cuales nos hemos sentido felices precisamente porque estábamos con Dios, porque teníamos paz interior. También debemos recordar aquellos otros en los que, por habernos alejado del Señor, las cosas han empezado a ir mal. Puede ser que eso no haya sucedido, porque no nos hayamos separado nunca de su lado. En ese caso, debemos fijarnos en lo que les ha pasado a los que lo han hecho, para darle gracias a Dios porque Él ha sido nuestro protector, la fuente de nuestra felicidad.

**Propósito:** Haz examen de conciencia para descubrir qué estás haciendo mal, en qué pozos de agua sucia bebes. Y luego confíesate. Da gracias a Dios porque, sin Él, no serías feliz.




Holy Thursday Mass will be at 6p.


Good Friday 2p Stations of the Cross and 3p Celebration of the Passion of the Lord.

### ***Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist***

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

### ***Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía***

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida. Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices **Amén**. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.



### **OCIA Classes Wednesday Evenings: 7-8:30p in Social Hall**

For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter. For additional information please call the office.

### **Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~**

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1<sup>st</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

### **Baptism**

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

### **Matrimony**

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

### **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
